### ELDORADO BANKS MAY CONSOLIDATE

With \$40,000 or \$50,000 Capital.

At a joint meeting Saturday night the two banks of Eldorado have partially agreed to consolidate, of course this agreement came from part of the directors and not all, a meeting was called for the stockholders of the First National Bank on December 10th at which time the consolidation will be fully discussed and the banks may be consolidated with not less than \$40,000 capital and probably a \$50,000. The new organization will probably be a State Bank or a Bank and Trust Company, which would do a grand thing for Eldorado and Schleicher county. We think the stockholders of each bank who

live within the boundaries of this county should look after the interest of Eldorado at the consolidation if her be one as for as we can learn most of the Stockholders of this county are in favor of increasing the capital stock to \$50,000 which would give us a splendid banking institution, one that the Divide City is worthy of. And we sincerely hope that at the meeting on December 10th that the interest of the people of Schleicher and Eldorado will be safely guarded and that either a State Bank, National Bank or a Bank and Trust Company will be organized with a \$50,000 Capital.

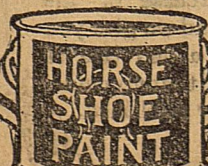

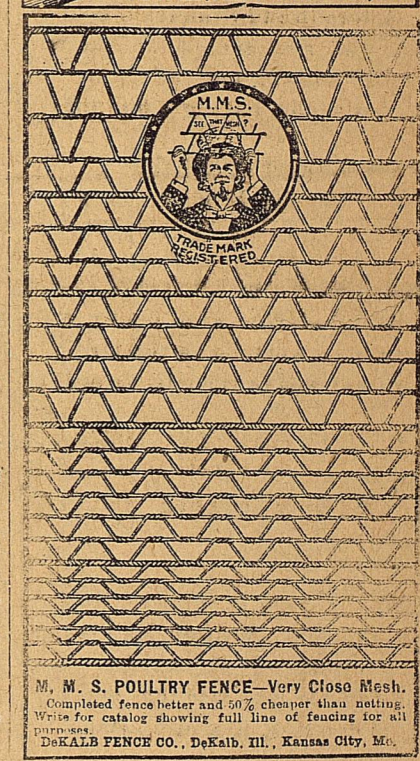
