Ben Anderson woo has been picking cotton for D. Patton on the old Vermont ranch, says the Doctor has gathered 23 bales of cotton off of 32 acres of land, and that the average weight above 500 pounds to the bale would easly make another bale, sa this land yeilded about 3-4 of a bale of cotton to the aere. This coltion was sold on the Eldorado market at a bout 81 cents per pound, which will make this land bring to it's owner \$37,12 1-2 per acre.


