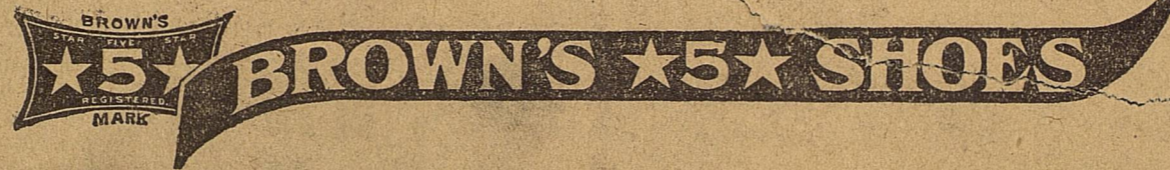

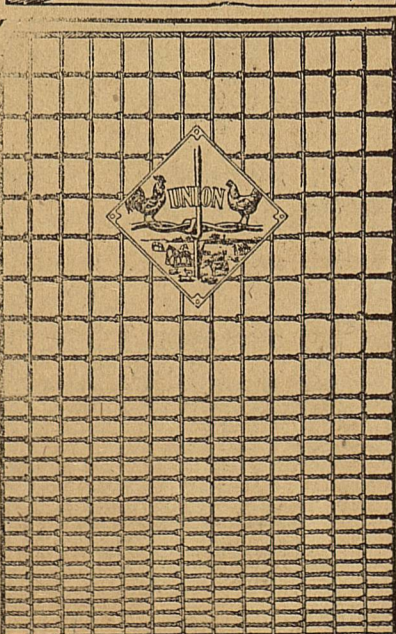
BANK MEETING.

To Whomever it may concern: Please take notice that the Kansas City, Mexico & Orient Railway Company of Texas, a corporation, intends to apply to the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Texas, to be convened in January, 1909, for the passage of a local or special law, the substance of which law is and will be to extend the time in which said Railway Company shall be required to comply with the provisions of Articles 4366, 4558, and 4559 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Texas as to the construction of the branch line of said Railway Company from a point at or near the city of San Angelo, Texas, in a general southerly or south easterly direction to a point on the Rio Grande at or near the town of Del Rio in Val Verde County, or to a point on the Rio Grande near the town of Brownsville, in Cameron County, Texas passing through some or all of the following named counties, to-wit: Tom Green, Schleicher, Sutton, Edwards, Val Verde, Kinney, Uvalde, Maverick, Zavalla, Dimmit, Webb, Zapata, Starr, Hidalgo, and Cameron, for the term of two years after the passage of such law or for such other term of extension as the Legislature may grant; and restore and preserve to said Railway Company all of the corporate powers and rights which it may have forfeited or lost, if any, by reason of its failure sooner to construct the portions of its said branch required by law.
