### A MEETING CALLED TO DISCUSS RAIL ROAD MATTERS.

A few of our leading business men ask THE SUCCESS to announce that there would be a meeting at the court house Saturday at 3 30, for the purpose of discussing rail road matters. There is no rail road proposition to consider at this meeting, but the intent of the meeting is to get a committee to look after any such matter that may come up. Below is a short clipping from the San Angelo Standard, which might mean something to this section, as the Morgan Jones road that is been built from Abeline to Ballinger, contemplates coming through this section of the country, here is the clipping.

"J. W. Broad, townsite agent for Morgan Jones, road from Abilene to Ballinger, was in San Angelo Sunday and left overland early Monday morning. He would give no information as to where he was going and the people were left to make conjectures as to what his trip means. Mr. Board is closely associated with all the enterprises of Morgan Jones, and it is reasonable to suppose that he is now looking over a route for the building of a road through this portion of the state. Sonora, it is stated, stands a good chance of getting the Jones road."

Such a road would open up a vast and extremely rich agricultural section and give san Antonio another much needed outlet to the north. The citizens of Big Springs, Texas, have donated \$65,000 for bonus and right of way, and work will begun on the road out of that city in less than a week. His contract call for the completion of fifty miles of road north through the town of south within the next eighteen month. The idea is eventually to go north and connect with san Antonio.

Dalhart is in Dallam county and San Angelo is on a direct line from that place to San Antonio, so if the road is ever built it will certainly come through this city which would not only connect San Angelo with San Antonio but provide another outlet to the north.—San Angelo Dailey Standard.

## THE LONG LOOKED FOR RAIN VISITED A LARGE PORTION OF SCHLESCHER COUNTY.

A splendid rain visited Eldorado and parts of Schlescher county Monday eve, this is something that has long been looked for and the only regret is that it only covered a portion of the county. The rain was heavy at the following ranches, Murchison and Silliman, Lum Roberts, Will Adams, Schuessler, H. M. Mills and Tiedales. The rain was light at Mayer, and the Douglass ranch, none in the Northwestern portion of the county. This rain will be worth lots to the stockmen of this section as well as the farmers where it extended.

Frank Murchison returned from the ranch Monday night and says that the hardest rain for years fell at his ranch Monday evening, the small draw in which one of his fields is in, was two hundred yards wide with water and about two feet deep. This will fill all the water holes on the ranch, and grass will be good in a few days, as this ranch received a pretty good rain about a month ago.

### WANTS TO MUCH.

The man from Iowa, J. J. Lantin, ask from the citizens of San Angelo, \$100,000 bonus for road from Sterling City to San Angelo, we wonder why the gentlemen from Iowa, does not ask Sterling City and Angelo to build the road and then give it to him, to run it. Sterling set down on the \$75,000, he ask from them but offered him \$50,000. Now let San Angelo make him a proposition of about \$50,000 and get the good work started. 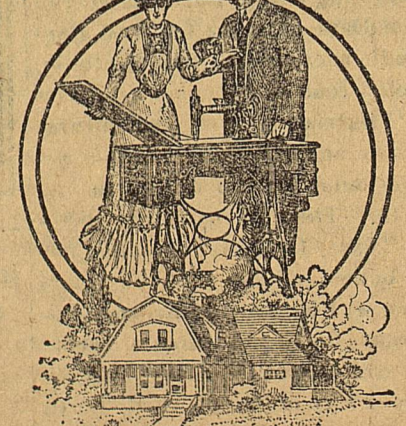
P. I. Elder was in from the ranch Tuesday, Pat says it didn't rain at their ranch Monday.

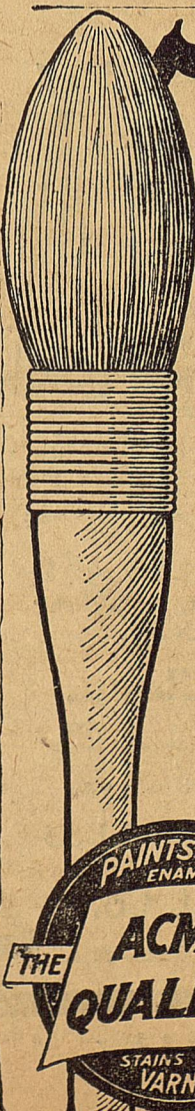


