At San Angelo April 12th and 13th Will Be Sold Under The Hammer.

There will occur in San Angelo on April 12th and April 13th two big auction sales of thoroughbred cattle to be conducted by price winning breeders whose names are the synonyms for the success in cattle raising in Texas.

April 12th 65 head of Durhams, Pole Durhams and Herefords belonging to the well known breeders, William Anson, D. T. Yaws and Lee Brothers will be sold under the hammer. Some of these cattle will also come from picturesque Bismarck farm.

This sale of April 12th will be held at the San Angelo Fair Grounds. It will begin promptly at 12 o'clock on the day mentioned. 

One of our merchants informed me that he would buy everything we could produce on our farm provided we would sack, box or bale it, with the assistance of such merchants as we have, we have been able to find a good market for our stuff. I wrote the Editor about a man making a living on one-half section of land in Schleicher county, he (the Editor) asks for a loan of a such doubting Thomases, we would like to have a train load, provided however, that they are the right sort, who do not need political growlers, nor those that sit on good boxes in front of the grocery store and cuss the government but what we need is real hustlers, men that are doing things.

We notice that there is a great railroad enterprise undertaken in quite a number of places, but our country is left out, there must be some good and sufficient reason for this. First we do not advertise, and there are but very few out side of our partially settled country that have a large area with a vast amount of undeveloped land here in and around Schleicher county, if the proper inducements was offered we feel sure that some company would build from San Angelo to Del Rio. It would certainly be a paying route, it would only require about seventy five miles of road from Del Rio to make connection with the Mexican International. It is a route which would give a direct route from Kansas City to the City of Mexico, construction work would be very cheap, almost all the stock that is now shipped from the Rio Grande country on the Southern Pacific would all come this way.
