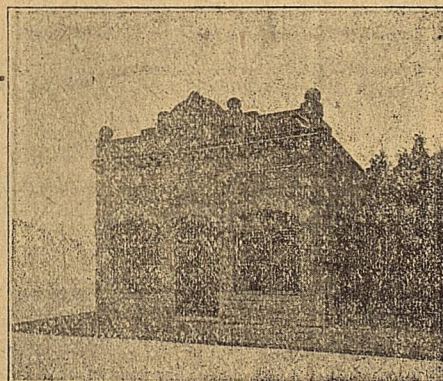

Silliman, who has the school work at heart, it will be remembered that a letter from Mr. Silliman announcing at the beginning of school, the above prizes was published in THE SUCCESS of September 11, 1908, and we reproduce the letter as was published then, so those who entering the contest will understand the conditions that they were to be a-

Dear Prof:—I want to give the following prizes and medals in the Eldorado school ensuing term and wants them announced at the beginning of the school.

For the pupil making the best average grade for the term in each room, a gold medal i. e. one medal to each room, five medals in all.

Then for your room, I am going to give \$25 in money to the boy or girl delivering the best original essay or oration at the close of school—none allowed to compete however, who have not made an average grade of 85 or better.

In making these grades the grades in department will be given the same consideration as the grades in the studies.

There will be two diplomas given at the close of school, the ones receiving them will be Misses Essie Alexander and Bertha West who graduate with the close of this school.
