IN MEMORY OF G. W. ANDERSON.

Born in Gree County, Alabama, September 15th, 1852 George W. Anderson moved with his parents to east Texas in 1832 where he grew up and was married to Miss Damron with whom he lived 55 years; she having died two years ago. To them were born eight children, seven boys and one girl. He lived to see five buried, and of the three surviving, Ben Anderson lives at Eldorado, James Anderson at Snyder and Mrs. J. R. Hext, with whom he made his home, at Rudd. On June 4th, 1846 he was mustered into U. S. service under General Taylor and served his time in the war with Mexico. In 1851 he joined the Masons, being at the time of his death among if not oldest Mason in Texas. In 1852 he joined Baptist Church, ordained a deacon in 1854, which office he filled with honor until his Master called him home.

He was the last of a large and interesting family of twenty-five children, of which sixteen were boys and nine girls.

He left an inheritance to his family and friends more precious than gold—a life fraught with good deeds.

His last days were spent in readiness and waiting, as he so often said, for the summons to come. He knew Whom he had believed and was persuaded that He was able to keep that which he had committed unto him.

So on August 31st, at 4 o'clock p. m. he fell to sleep never to awake on earth again. His body was laid to rest with Masonic honors in Eldorado cemetery near his faithful wife, to await the Resurrection Morn.

Give me a life of service and the dying testimony which he gave, then I can say

"Let the world have its diamonds, its silver and gold, I am richer by far with the title I hold; I am heir to a kingdom, a crown and a throne That shall stand when earth's kingdoms are all overthrown."

All the brick that will be required in the construction is on the ground and the walls are all ready up to the first story windows. The brick was finished by the local brick factory. Under the contract, held by P. A. Williams of this city, the building is to be completed by January 1st, 1910. Dear Sir: The real test of a paint is how many square feet with a gallon of it cover? And all the paints wear they cover 300 square feet two coats, Mithy, they provaricat. L. H. Ferchaud: bulder, 1108 Durpe St. New Orleans, covered 1900 square feet with three gallons Devoo last year; and sainted all his jobs Devoo. That's how the tale gets to us. He doesn't say whether one or two coats; if, there's nothing wonderful in it; if two, they must have very small feet in New Orleans. Devoo does t stop at 300 feet, but over 600! Most paints, we suppose, can be stretched to 300 feet, but they're mighty thin, they cover well 150 to 200. When N R Watkins, L. tt Texas, painted his house before, it took 13 gallons, Devoo 7 gallon. That shows the strength of the paints W B McCluney painted a house in Crystal Springs, Miss, to test two pure paints; one coat 6 gallons Devoo, the other coat 10 gallons of a New Orleans paint surface differ one takes more, another takes less, Devoo covers more than any other paint; two to one in the case of half the paints. But how many it covers, we don't know till we see the surface.

SANTA FE TO ELDORADO SOON.

San Saba, Texas Sept. 20 In accordance with the recent announcement of vice president F. G. Pettibone of the Gulf, Colorado and Santa Fe railroad, that the line into this place will be extended to Eldorado Schleicher county, soon, surveyors are now at work on the preliminary survey west of here. It is understood from a recent announcement of the road's vice president that the line to Eldorado may also be extended further than that in a southwest-ru direction, something like 100 miles. Mr. Pettibone said in his announcement, according to advice from the road's headquarters at Galveston, that the country to be tapped by this line has long been in need of a railroad, and that it is rich, fertile and full of possibilities of development. He also said that the line might not go to Eldorado and that that point could not be decided till the preliminary surveys were made and reported on.

Galveston, Texas Sept. 20, — engineers official of the Gulf Colorado and Santa Fe railroad is busy figuring on a line of the road, to run west from the main line, at some point near Lometa, to San Saba, in San Saba county, and then south west to a point near Eldorado, in Schleicher county.

The department has engineers in the field, and according to the announcement of Vice-President Pettibone, made last Friday, San Angelo, in Tom Green county, may be connected with the new line. The Santa Fe has recently started a line from San Angelo, in a northwesterly direction.
