A Message from Eldorado's Ministerial Alliance

In I Peter 2:9, 10 Peter describes Christians as God's chosen people. Just as ancient Israel became God's chosen people when they pledged themselves to the covenant found in Exodus 19, Christians, the new spiritual Israel, have covenanted with God through the salvation in which they have trusted. This salvation was made possible through the death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus. As God's new people, according to the Spirit, Christians are a people of purpose. God's people, who have experienced a spiritual rebirth, are a "chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own, that we might show forth the praises of him who hath called us out of darkness into his marvelous light."

We are living in a time when much interest is geared toward the idea of "roots". Alex Haley's quest for his personal roots led him to Africa and the beginning of his family through the people who lived in a tiny village. With that knowledge, he had a sense of "roots" that he had never known before. The people of God, born-against Christians, have their roots in the promises of God. The one who said we must be reborn (John 3), also said he would never forsake us. The people of God have spiritual roots that grow deeper than any earthly kind of roots. God's people are precious in his sight. Christians are God's very delight. They are his favored people. They are his precious possession.

In Malachi, God's children are compared to jewels, or precious stones. Consider the characteristics of a jewel. A jewel is formed in the earth, hewn and fashioned and polished by a master craftsman and made to be a thing of beauty and infinite value. When God, the Master Craftsman of life, shapes and forms our lives, how we can sparkle and bring joy to others! But, as his people, as his treasured jewels, we must allow the rough places to be smoothed away. Sometimes the cutting is deep and penetrating. Sometimes it takes a long time to transform the diamond-in-the-rough into anything of worth and beauty. But when the transformation is complete, a diamond may be used to cut another stone, to add more jewels to the crown. Let us then not be content to remain hidden and untouched in the dark recesses of the earth, but rather give ourselves over to Him in whose hands our lights will shine out before men to illuminate a sin-sick world!

Indeed, Christians are people with purpose in living. We are to proclaim that God has brought us out of the darkness of sin into the light of his presence through the forgiveness found in His Son. As the people of God, we have an exciting adventure to live. We can lead others to the fulfillment in life that we possess.

If you have not been reborn spiritually, you can be. If you are not a spiritual child in the heavenly Father, you can be. Trust in the Lord Jesus (John 3:16) and join the people of God in a congregation of your choice. The godly person has roots that no other roots can replace. The godly person has strength that cannot come from anything or anyone, but his heavenly Father. It is said of the child of God, "And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth its fruit in its season; its leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper" (Psalm 1:3). That's the kind of roots the world craves and needs!
