Accurate Representation Depends On The Census

Jym Trimble and Lisa Watson, census workers for the Schleicher County area are still in the process of collecting census forms. Due to a shortage of workers it is taking longer to pick up the forms than first anticipated.

Teri Tarvin of Big Lake, crew leader for district #17 which includes Schleicher, Irion and Reagan Counties, said that it is important for the forms to be filled out and

turned in to the workers when they come by. An accurate count of our county will determine the number of congressmen we will have in Washington, D.C. It also means the amount of federal funding our county receives in time of need.

All information given to the workers is confidential and law (title 13, U.S. Code) census employees are subject to fine and/or imprisonment for any disclosure of your answers.

Only after 72 years does your information become available to other government agencies or the public. The same law requires that you answer the questions to the best of your knowledge.

Anyone wishing to work for the census may call Teri Tarvin, in Big Lake, 884-3321. Graduates that would like to work for the summer may also apply. There will be a need for follow-up workers.

Producers Gas Loans Equipment

Producers Gas has given the city of Eldorado access to sophisticated gas sniffing equipment to help locate gas leaks on the city's gas mains. Because of this public service, Producers has helped the city save several hundred dollars a day.

An employee of Producers has volunteered his off duty hours to help the city locate the leaks with the equipment. The employee and the city agreed on a salary and the only cost to the city is the hours he works.

Dale Fisher of Fisher Sales Company in Big Lake, presented the city council last Tuesday, May 13, with estimated costs of using polyethylene pipe and explained the process involving the use of this type pipe.

As soon as the city has completed the survey on the leaks, and prepares an estimate of footage requiring replacement, Fisher will be contacted for further figures.

The council met with Television Enterprises representatives Ken Gunter, Jody Shields, and Jimmy Francks regarding renewal of the cable franchise which expires January 1, 1981. After a brief history of the current franchise, the sample ordinance granting the franchise was discussed with changes explained by Gunter. The city will investigate procedures and suggest changes as soon as possible.

Anyone on the cable with complaints with reception or service, call the city secretary at the city hall.

The council granted all city employees a ten percent cost of living raise, effective June 1. The city secretary and outside supervisor's salaries were converted to hourly wages for bookkeeping purposes, effective June 1.

Irrigation agreement of sewer water with Joe Christian was reviewed and an amendment will be made by the city. It will be taken up

at the next meeting in order to forward a copy to the Texas Water Resources.

The Council reported that all supplies for the fence at the city landfill had been received and that Mr. Yocham was making good progress in building the fence. The rain had delayed him for awhile. Shelter for the landfill attendant, and a telephone hookup is being investigated by the city.

The city reported they are still having trouble controlling dumping inside the city limits.

Anyone finding a dead dog or killing a dog in the city limits, may call the city for the dead animal to be picked up. With rabies prevalent in the Schleicher County area, any dead animal found in the city will need to be picked up and burned at the city landfill.

Richey New Elementary Principal

Richard A. Richey of Ballinger has been named the new elementary school principal for Eldorado. Richey resigned last Wednesday, May 14, from his job as Ballinger Independent School District Superintendent, which he had held for 14 years. Richey stated that he is taking the position of less responsibility to have a closer contact with the students.

Applicants for the position were reviewed by the school board at last week's meeting, May 13. Superintendent Buy Whitaker recommended Richey and the board agreed to hire him. He will be replacing Walter Wallis.

The board met with architect, Gary Donaldson, and toured the new construction sites. He gave an update on the construction and made a presentation on the remodeling of the existing buildings. A description of the furniture to be purchased for the new and remodeled buildings was given also.

Bids for the furniture and the architect contract for the remodeling will be taken at a special called school board meeting May 29, at 5 p.m.

Heritage Insurance Company of San Antonio was selected by the board as the insurance for the 1980-81 school year.

Mort Mertz, Bob Sykes, and Delia Pena were named to the Board of Equalization.

The board accepted resignations from John Rodriguez and Janet Curtis.

Mary Ruth Wallis was refunded approximately \$371 that was withheld from her checks for social security in 1972-73 that was not sent in.

An updated review of the salary increases for teachers, aids, secretaries, and administrators that was approved in April was left as agreed upon.

Three sections of the budget were amended from surplus funds from other sections of the budget.

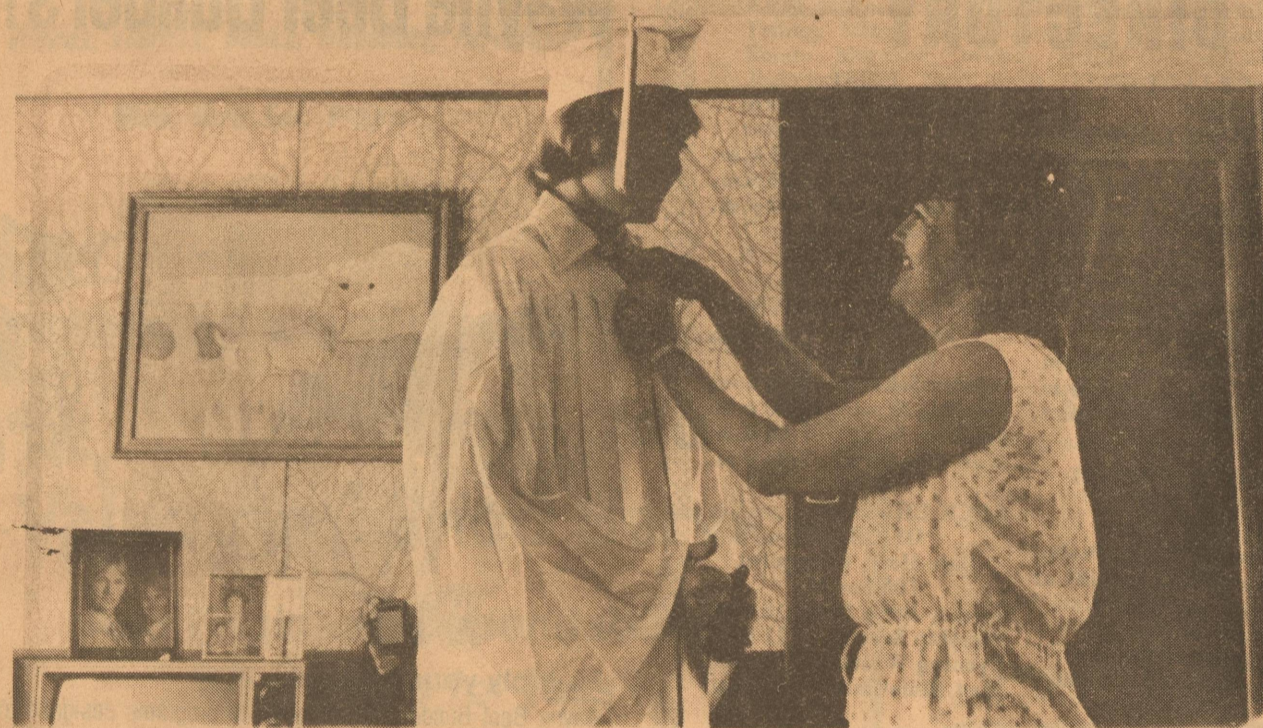
Girls outstanding track award was earned by Silva Gauna and girls outstanding basketball award by Toni Fatheree.

Phil George Commencement Speaker

Phil George, Angelo State University Athletic Director, will be the guest speaker at commencement exercises for the 1980 graduates of Eldorado High School at 8 p.m. Friday in the high school auditorium.

Forty-four seniors will receive their diplomas during the program. Valedictorian is Mary Byrd and Lorrie Powell is salutatorian. Four year honor graduates with a grade point average of 90 or above are Laura Gentry, Jolynn Jay, Joy Corbell, Janet Bradshaw, Lori Edmiston, Curtis Griffin, and Jeanie Nicholson.

Ron Sutto, First Presbyterian minister, will offer the invocation and Don Williford, pastor of the First Baptist Church, will give the benediction. Diplomas will be presented by Dr. J.B. Brame and Richard McCarron, high school principal, will present the awards. The valedictorian and salutatorian will give speeches. EHS Band will play during the processional and recessional. The band will also present special music entitled My Way.

Phil George is not in his 31st year with the Rams at ASU. George came to San Angelo College in 1949 and since then has worked with the

basketball, football, track, baseball and golf programs. For 11 seasons, George served as Football Line

Coach. During this span, seven linemen received All-American honors. He was Ram Basketball Coach from 1949 to 1978.

George is one of the winningest college basketball coaches in the country with a record of 514 wins and 244 losses.

Conference Coach-of-the-Year honors have been bestowed on Coach George eight times. NJCAA Coach-of-the-Year in 1957, NAIA district eight Coach-of-the-Year in 1967, and NAIA district four Coach-of-the-Year in 1976. The Rams'

Junior College cage squads won Pioneer Conference titles in 1954, 1955, 1957, 1959, 1960, 1961, 1962, 1963, and 1964 under George. In addition, the Rams won NJCAA regional titles in 1957, 1959, 1961, 1962, and 1964, and the 1957 squad won the NJCAA National Junior College crown.

For the past 12 years, George has served as Athletic Director and Associate Professor of Health and Physical Education.

The Ram Athletic Program has shown rapid growth under George in the past six years, winning

several Lone Star Conference championships, development of numerous All-Americans as well as LSC All-Sports Championship and District 4 NAIA All-Sports champions. For the years 1972, 1973 and 1974 the ASU Athletic Program has

ranked in the top twenty NAIA All-Sports Championship Schools—in an organization that includes some 565 schools.

George earned his Bachelor of Science and Master of Education Degrees, plus additional work toward a Doctoral Degree from the University of Texas at Austin. During his career as a UT cager, the Longhorns finished third in NCAA in 1947, played in the National Invitational Tournament in 1948, and won two Southwest Conference championships. Over this span, (1942-43, 1946-49) the Longhorns won 87 and lost only 14.

During World War II George served as an Army Air Cop pilot in China-Burma-India theater of operation. He was recalled in 1968 and served for one and a half years in Viet Nam, Europe and U.S. Retired from USAF Reserve as a Lt. Col. with over 6,500 pilot hours.

George and his wife, Toddy, have three children, Jennifer, Judy, and Mike.
