

City enters into contract with Appraisal District

In a busy meeting Tuesday evening March 13th, the Eldorado City Council agreed to enter into a joint contract with the Schleicher County Appraisal District to collect taxes. Ray Lewis Ballew representing the district met with the Council to review the proposal. The collection is scheduled to begin April 1st.

A concerned James Harris appeared before the Council to request their consideration on the payment of damages done to his carpet when the sewer backed up. Mr. Harris claimed that he requested that his line be checked in December because it was stopped up. No workorder could be found on the job, the City crew did check it out. Secretary Carolyn Mayo was instructed to look into the matter further before any action was taken by the Council.

Secretary Mayo gave an update on the C.D.B.G. and bond projects to the Council. The bids for Wastewater Plant will be opened April 10th and the Secretary requested the Council's advisement on running the bid request in the Standard Times. She was requested to get a price on the advertisement and report back to the Council.

A discussion was held concerning

the Sonora landfill and the prices charged to the various sized vehicles utilizing the dump. Although no action was taken by the Council, they discussed at length the neighboring city's regulations and how Eldorado might incorporate them at the City's landfill.

Sonora's policy on truck traffic was also a source of discussion Tuesday night. The "no truck traffic" policy instituted by Sonora keeps traffic off residential streets and the council invited Sheriff Orval Edmiston to the next meeting to discuss the possibility of Eldorado enacting such a policy.

Secretary Mayo reported that two prices for the Cities Service check meter run had been obtained. The Council agreed to table the matter until after the April 7th election.

The amendment to the Peddler's Permit Ordinance #105-83 was read and approved by the Council.

Other subjects touched on by the Council included Jim Hardy's development of certain acreage southeast of the City limits; ambulance drivers, repairs on the landfill house and completion of a well in Edgefield.

After no further business was brought before the Council the meeting adjourned.

The Eaglettes came in fifth place behind Sonora, Iraan, Ozona and Crane. The girls took first place in the 400 Relay with the team of Aguilar, Patton, Hill and Robinson with a time of 54.69. Kara Garlitz brought home an impressive second place in the Shot Put with a throw of 32'8".

points. Sonora won the meet with 130 points. The boys took first place awards for the 600 Meter Run - Montalvo; 100 Meter Dash - Preston, 12.77 and 400 Meter Relay - 4th place - Martinez, Roubison, Regaldo and Preston; 300 Meter Dash - 4th place - Hernandez; 200 Low Hurdles - 3rd place - Montalvo and 4th place - Martinez; 200 Meter Dash - 4th place - Preston; Shot Put - 3rd place - Regaldo; Discus - 2nd place - Rudy Sanchez; Long Jump - 2nd place - Preston; High Jump 4th and 5th place - tied by Montalvo.

One of my all-time favorite foods is fried Chinese noodles with a pork chop on top. This isn't a fancy example of Chinese cooking. Rather, this is the kind of food that the street peddlers sell. The kind of food that the average Chinese person might eat at a neighborhood restaurant. When I lived in Tai Pei City, there was a certain restaurant, a lean-to really, that was built up against the brick wall of a commercial building located on my daily route to work. The thing which made this restaurant special to me was the way the woman who ran the

place could cook a pork chop. She had a secret recipe of flour and seasonings that transformed her pork chops into an unforgettable experience in dining out. Her place of business was small and her entire family lived in a loft overhead but she made the best pork chops that I have ever eaten.

This woman reminds me of what Peter wrote in the Bible when he said that "Each one should use whatever spiritual gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms." The woman in my story could

have given up and quit trying. She was poor, her family was poor, but she took her talent with pork chops and turned it into a restaurant where she earned a living for her children. How many Christians refuse to believe that God has given them a talent or gift with which they are supposed to serve the Body of Christ? How many Christians have given up and have refused to serve God with the gift he has given them? Stir up the gift that God has placed within you. Do you dare to serve others or have you given up already?

WHAT ARE HOMESTEAD EXEMPTIONS?

This public service message from the State Property Tax Board, local taxing authorities and this newspaper explains exemptions.

A homestead exemption is a reduction in the taxable value of your residence homestead. Various types of homestead exemptions are available in Texas and, if you qualify, they can reduce your total property tax bill. Read on for details.

What Exemptions Are Available?

School districts offer a residence homestead exemption to all homeowners and additional exemptions to persons who are disabled or over 65.

Counties offer homestead exemptions on their farm-to-market or flood control tax rate, and may offer optional exemptions to the disabled and elderly.

Cities and other taxing districts may offer optional exemptions to the disabled and elderly.

All taxing units offer an exemption for certain disabled veterans on one designated property.

Additionally, some taxing units offer a local option, percentage homestead exemption to resident homeowners.

How Do I Apply?

If you received a residence homestead exemption on your present homestead in 1983, it will not be necessary for you to make a new application for 1984 in this appraisal district.

If you were 65 or disabled on January 1 and have not previously filed for the over-65 or disability homestead exemption, you will need to make application this year.

Or, if you have never received a homestead exemption on your present home, an original application should be filed in 1984.

Applications for all exemptions should be made to the county appraisal district at the address shown below. Forms are available from the appraisal office.

Is There a Deadline?

For 1984, applications should be filed before May 1. While late applications for exemptions may be accepted in certain instances, you can fully protect your rights by applying before May 1.

The State Property Tax Board has a pamphlet, *Taxpayers' Rights, Remedies, Responsibilities*, to help you understand your local property taxes. Get a free copy at the appraisal district office or contact the State Property Tax Board in Austin.
