## ORDINANCE NO, 206

an ordinance fixing the tax rate and levy in AND FOR THE CITY OF MCLEAN, TEXAS, FOR THE said city of Mclean, texas, for the purpose of providing for the general fund for the FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 1983; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY; PROVIDING THAT IN THE EVENT ANY PROVISION OF THIS ORDINANCE BE HELD UNCONSTITUTIONAL AND INVALID, THAT SUCH HOLDING OF; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCE AND PARTS THEREOF IN CONFLICT HEREWITH
be it ordained by the city counctl of the city of mclean, texas:
SECTION . There is hereby levied for the year 1982, upon all real property situated within the corporate limits of said City ofmcLean, limit, and on all personal property which was owned within the corporate 1982, except so much thereof as maybe exempt by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, a total of $45 / 100$ th ( $\$ .45$ ) Dollars on each said property, which said total tax is levied in the protions hereinafter set forth in this ordinance

SECTION 2. An ad valorem tax of and at the rate of $45 / 100$ th Dollar on each one hundred and no/100 ( $\$ 100.00$ ) Dollars of assessed valuation of said taxable property is hereby levied for the year 1982 for the purpose of providing revenue for the General Fund in the City of McLean, Texas, shall be approriated and deposited in and to the credit of the General fund of the City of McLean, Texas

SECTION 3. All taxes herein levied shall be due and apyable on the first day of October 1982. Such taxes not paid in full by the 31st of January, 198, shall bear peralty and R.C.S. of Texas.

SECTION 4. All Ordinances and parts thereof in conflict with any of the provisions of this ordinance are hereby expressly repealed

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the city Council of the City of McLean, Texas, that notice of the enactment of this Ordinance be given by publication of the same in the official newspaper of the city
