State Representative J.W. "Buck" Buchanan of Dumas this week formally announces his candidacy for re-election in the Texas 88th Legislative District.

Wish Britten Escapes Injury

Firemen were called last Friday morning to extinguish a fire at the home of A.F. "Wish" Britten. Mr. Britten had walked to his bedroom to take a nap when he smelled smoke in the house. He found a chair in the living room to be on fire and drove to Martin Hermesmeier's home to alert the fire department. Firemen removed a flaming chair from the house and quickly extinguished all flames.

Although the chair was the only furniture damaged by flames, the entire house suffered severe smoke damage and some water damage.

Mr. Britten was not injured in the fire and will be staying with family members until his home can be refurbished.

The North Plains native has a long record of service in agriculture, civic and youth work, and has received a number of awards for his achievements, locally and regionally.

Buchanan is recognized as a leading authority on North Plains and Texas water resources and has worked in developing Texas water plans and legislation.

Representative Buchanan was elected in 1980 and again in 1982 and 1984 in his present tenure, but had served two terms in the Texas House several years back. He serves on three permanent House Committees; they are Natural Resources, County Affairs and House Administration. He has been named by the House Speaker to serve on three interim committees to prepare recommendations on legislation at the next session in 1987.

"I believe that my experience in the Legislature, at different periods, gives me a perspective to effectively serve the area. I will work to assure that the people of the 88th District have their needs heard and met in Austin."



Representative Buchanan devotes all of his time to his job as Representative in the District and in Austin and says of the office: "I have worked constructively in Austin for the Panhandle and I have worked to defeat legislation that served special interests or that increased State spending needlessly and carelessly. I am proud to have a record of being conservative and responsible, as my district expects me to be."

Preliminary results for the first administration of a graduation test given to 191,000 Texas eleventh graders showed 84.6 percent of the students passed the two-part exam.

On individual sections of the test, 91 percent passed the English language arts portion and 88 percent passed the mathematics section. In Groom, 95 percent passed the language arts and 90 percent the mathematics.

Beginning with the graduating class of 1987, students must pass the TEAMS exit-level test in order to receive a high school diploma.

"I am asking your support and vote in the 1986 election on my record of serving the district," Buchanan adds. "I will be visiting over the district in the months ahead to keep abreast of the people's needs and wishes—and to ask and thank you for your support."

State-wide TEAMS Scores Show Better Than Expected Results

The exam, which was administered for the first time on Oct. 1 and 2, was mandated by the Legislature in 1984 as part of the education reforms contained in House Bill 72.

Students who failed either section of the test will have at least three more opportunities to pass the exam before they graduate.

"The TEAMS test serves two purposes," said Jon Brumley, chairman of the State Board of Education.

"First, it helps us ensure that students possess the basic reading, writing and mathematical skills they will need when they enter the adult world. Secondly, it lets the schools know where they are doing a good job—and where they are doing a poor job—in educating their students.

"We are very pleased with these results," Brumley said, "but we hope school districts will use the information they gain from them to help improve the academic performances of those students who failed."

Surveys of students and educators indicated that some students had not received adequate instruction in seven TEAMS test objectives that were covered in new statewide curriculum standards put into full effect this school year.

Therefore, incorrect answers to eight questions in two of the English language arts objectives and 20 questions in five math objectives were not counted against students.

A passing standard of 70 percent was applied to the remaining test questions.

Kirby said the State Board of Education will consider raising the cutoff score for the test within the next two years, meaning school districts will have to work even harder to ensure that students are adequately prepared for the exam.

"Based on the excellent efforts of our school districts to prepare students for this first TEAMS test, I have no doubt we will continue to see our students rise to meet these higher expectations."

Additional preliminary data from the October test showed that male and female students performed equally well on the mathematics test with 88 percent passing.

City Council Approves Utility Rates

The McLean City Council met in its regular session on Dec. 20. Council members present were Martha Jo Bailey, Dr. H.F. Fabian, George Green and Mayor George Terry.

Others in attendance were Robert E. Glenn, Britt Hathaway and Stella Lee.

Major items of business were:

-Discussion concerning utility rates. It was agreed to set regular water rates at \$5.00 minimum for the first 3,000 gallons, 65 cents per thousand for the next 7,000

gallons and 50 cents per thousand for all over 10,000 gallons. The summer water rates were fixed at \$10.00 for the first 20,000 gallons and 50 cents per thousand for all over 20,000 gallons.

-Agreement not to enter into a delinquent tax contract at this time.

-Approval of a measure to join with the McLean School District in purchasing voting booths and holding elections, using the same ballot, subject to approval from school authorities.

-Approval of the transfer of \$2,000 from the Water

Deposit Fund and \$4,000 from the Gas deposit fund into a McLean Fund.

-Approval of the transfer of \$1,025 from the Revenue Sharing Fund to the Firemen's Relief and Retirement Fund to pay retirement benefits for 1985.

-Approval of Ordinance #219 setting SPS rates.

-Acceptance of a bid by P.M. Hobbs of Shamrock to cover the old landfill for \$7,900.

-Approval of a measure to give \$30 to each employee as longevity pay.

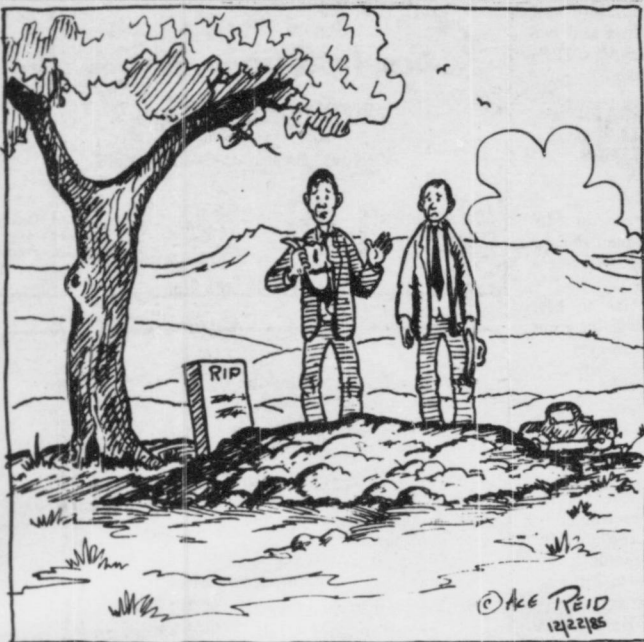

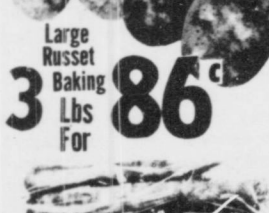

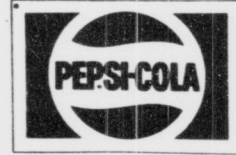
