Miss Duke To Vie For Miss West Texas Title

offices. According to Republican Party officials in the county, the fee can be waived by filing for office with a petition.

To file by petition requires signatures from 2% of the number of persons voting in the last governor's race in the state. Those signing the petition must be informed that their signature guarantees that they vote in the primary of the ticket the candidate chooses to run on. Signers are of course at liberty to vote either party in the General Election. The completed petitions are then filed with the appropriate party chairmen.

To qualify for public office, one must be a citizen of Texas, a registered voter, at least 18 years of age and must have resided in Carson County for six months.

The judge acts as chief executive officer of the commissioners court. He handles criminal and probate cases in the county, is a member of the district juvenile board, handles indigent care and is responsible for preparation of the agenda for commissioners court meetings.

The county clerk serves both the county court and district court as record keeper. The office also handles marriage license, birth and death certificates, real estate transactions, deeds and trusts, and records of livestock brands. The office also oversees elections and maintains eligible jury lists.

The county treasurer disburses all county funds upon the approval of county commissioners court as well as doing book work for the county and other county officials offices. Carson County also maintains a county auditor. The position is appointed rather than an elective office.

County Commissioners serve on the commissioners court. They are responsible for establishing and maintaining a budget, overseeing the county jail and other public facilities and programs. They are involved within their own pre-

cinct for establishment and change and or discontinuing public roads and highways; responsible for building bridges and keeping them in repair; appoints road maintenance labor; provide for the repair of the courthouse, jail and other public buildings, audit and settle all accounts against the county for to help provide indigent care in the county.

Justice of the Peace positions in Carson County include one stationed in Skellytown, Groom and Panhandle. Their responsibilities include jobs such as handling Class C Misdemeanors, traffic violations, parks and wildlife violations, civil cases and death inquiries.

All these elected officials serve four year terms.

Salaries for county officials have risen during the past four years 8 percent. The elective offices pay according to the following scale according to the budget published for 1985-86. Judge, \$27,466; Clerk, \$25,519; Treasurer, \$25,519; Commissioner, \$21,857. Justice of the Peace in Precincts 1, (Panhandle) and 5 (Groom) receive \$18,415 Precinct 6 Skellytown receives \$13,475.

In addition to salaries, officials receive retirement benefits, medical and life insurance as well as social security and workers and employment compensation.
