## Auction Raises \$12,593 To Begin Renovation

Members of Groom Economic Development Corporation termed the auction held Saturday a success with \$12,593.25 raised toward renovation of the building. Buyers from all over the Texas panhandle came from as far away as Lockney and Shamrock to purchase items in the auction. There were 117 registered buyers including doctors, hospital administrators and local citizens.

Cob Britten and Pat Britten volunteered their services as auctioneers for the event. A number of purchases were made for sentimental value including

the hospital safe and a foot stool used by Dr. Witt after a long day in surgery as he began paper work.

Now that the money has been made, the first item of repair to the building will be the portion of the roof that leaks. The GEDC plans to take bids on that portion of the work.

"Work is expected to commence in the next few days," said Johnny Brumley head of the efforts to get the building into shape as a community center. The work force will include 10 team leaders with three additional members on each work

team. "The first priority will be to get the clinic relocated as soon as possible," said Brumley, "to give it some degree of permanence here in Groom."

By now the plans for the building have been unveiled to each and every civic group. The building will include facilities for the clinic, community meeting hall and possibly offices and housing for the elderly.

"With volunteered labor, continued donations and memorials, we will be able to move toward accomplishing goals for the building," said Brumley.

## City Council Purchases Computer For Billings

A new computer has been installed at City Hall and city Secretary Pat Ashford will soon begin transfer of all utility billings to the new machine. "If all goes well, January statements will be prepared through the use of the computer system," said Mrs. Ashford. The computer was purchased in hopes of streamlining that operation. The system was purchased from the Fort Worth Firm, Municipal Data Systems. The city visited with two other cities connected to the same system before making a decision on what system would best serve the needs of Groom.

In last week's council meeting, Linda Maxey of PRPC met with the council discussing the termination of work on the \$224,543 grant secured for water storage expansion. All phases of the project are now complete with all of the money expended except the \$500 reserve for the audit. The audit will be performed Nov. 17 by a state auditor.

Annexation plans for the

Ziegler Addition were discussed. The first hearing on the matter will be Nov. 17 at City Hall. All interested persons wishing to make comment on the issue should appear and be heard at the 7:00 p.m. hearing. Barring any exceptions to the annex-

ation, the proceedings for annexation will be held at City Hall on Dec. 22.

Items discussed and tabled for the Nov. 17 meeting were utility charges to the JP office and feasibility of hiring a city judge.

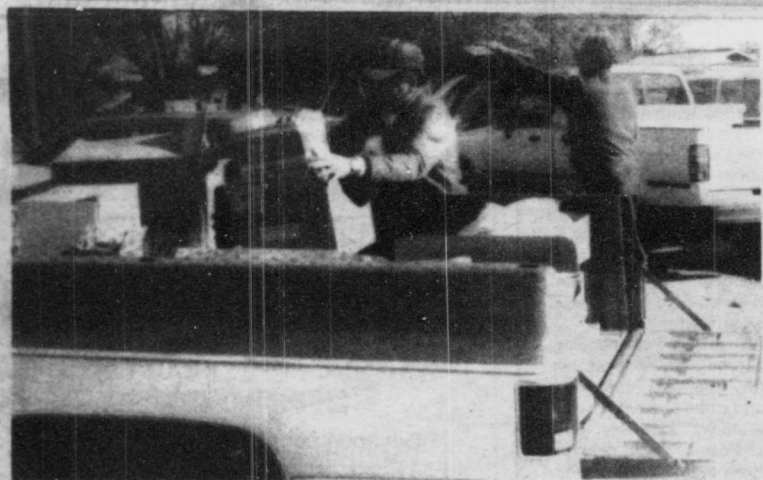

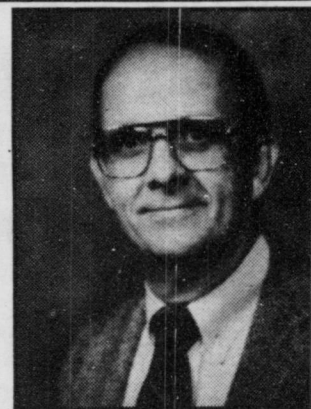

### DPS Gives Safe Winter Driving Tips To Motorists

The Texas Department of Public Safety reminds motorists that the winter season is upon us, and it's time once again to get both the driver and the vehicle in the best possible condition for this most grueling driving season.

Major V.J. Cawthon, Commander of the DPS, Region 5, said, "Winter driving can be very hazardous. Driver's are faced with many dangerous obstacles: nights are longer, freezing temperatures, snow, sleet, and ice covered roads, all creating handicaps for the driver.

The most important safety tip for winter driving is to "slow down." On ice covered roads, only drive when it's necessary and realize that it's going to take you at least twice as long to cover that same distance that you drove when the road was dry and clear of ice. So, remember to set more time aside for driving under winter conditions.

When temperatures drop below the freezing point, drivers must guard against reduced visibility caused by frosted windows and windshields. Allow your cars engine to warm up and for the defroster to become effective before driving. Be sure you windows and headlights are clear and free of any obstructions like snow or mud. Do all this in advance, before you hit the road."

The DPS reminds you that the hazards of winter driving can be reduced. "It's in your hands, the defensive driver, to make for a safer winter."

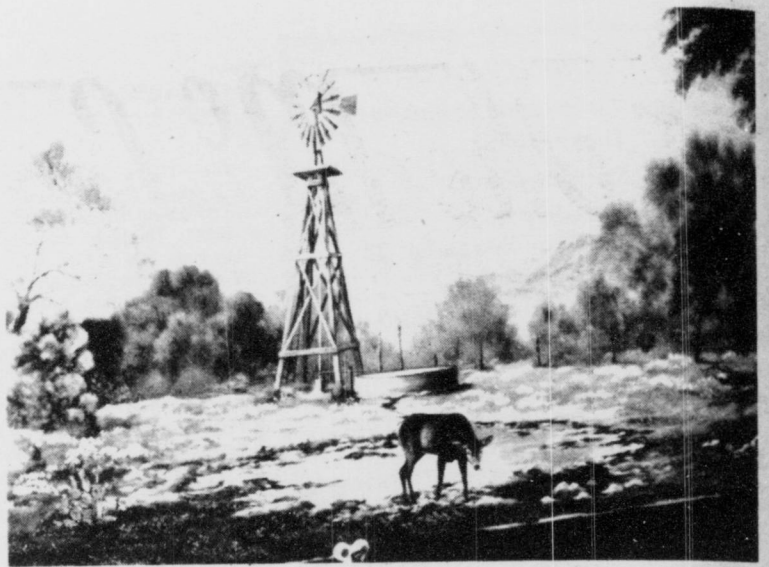

## Haynes Gets Award



Mike Haynes, son of Mr. and Mrs. John M. Haynes, received a national publications adviser award Nov. 8 during a College Media Advisers convention in Washington, D.C.

Haynes, 35, is editorial adviser for The University Daily and La Ventana year-

book at Texas Tech in Lubbock. He has worked in Texas Tech Student Publications the past three years.

At the Washington convention, he accepted the annual Honor Roll Award for four-year college advisers. The award is given to an outstanding adviser who has been in the field fewer than five years.

He also served as a panelist in one of the convention sessions with advisers from Indiana University and Washington University.

Haynes worked for the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal as a copy editor and assistant city editor for six years and was sports editor of the Humble Echo near Houston for more than a year. He was editor and publisher of The McLean News in 1978.

He is a 1969 graduate of McLean High School and a 1973 graduate of Texas Tech.

## Simmons Retains Seat

In one of the most strongly contested races in last week's election, incumbent Commissioner Ted Simmons retained his seat against Democratic challenger Tony Smitherman and write-in candidate Buddy Epperson.

Earlier in the year, Simmons had joined the Republican Party causing the Democrats to put up Tony Smitherman as a challenger. Recently, as the controversy built over use of public money to build a golf course in Pampa, Buddy Epperson added his name by signing up as a write-in candidate.

In the final totals of the election, Simmons hauled in 1550 county-wide votes while getting 281 in Precinct 5, which includes the McLean area. Smitherman had 784 votes in the county and 203 in the precinct. Epperson had 422 total votes with only 3 coming from the

precinct.

In another race, that of District Clerk, the incumbent Mary Clark was not so lucky. She lost to Republican challenger Vickie Walls. Walls beat Clark 4385 to 3806. However, in Precinct 5, Mrs. Clark got 234 votes to Mrs. Walls' 227.

In the battle for County Treasurer, Democrat Lodema Mitchell, who has served as Deputy Treasurer for many years, also lost to a Republican challenger Scott Hahn of Pampa. Mr. Hahn got 4265 county votes to Mrs. Mitchell's 3902, while in Precinct 5, she outranked him 243 to 199.
