Mamie Poole Named To Rt. 66 Hall Of Fame



Mamie Poole was installed to the Route 66 Hall of Fame in ceremonies held Saturday at the Devils Rope Museum in McLean.

Poole was one of ten to be honored for their individual contributions during the heyday of what is lovingly referred to as the "mother road."

Master of ceremonies, Delbert Trew, stated that the Texas Chapter of the Route 66 Association was formed in 1990 to promote tourism and preserve the Route 66 phenomenon for the future. The road from

Chicago to Los Angeles saw the largest migration of people ever in the U.S. Occurring during the post World War II era it began a whole new way of life for people, giving birth to the motel, roadside parks, and paid vacations, stated Trew.

Poole has had several restaurants along Rt. 66 through the years including the Longhorn Cafe that was completely designed by her.

"It was really an innovation, with the most modern equipment available," stated Poole.

Reminiscing of the days when to get to Groom from

Shamrock she had to spend much time and effort pushing cars out of the way to get through the treacherous Jericho Gap when the weather was rainy, she said "We never thought anything about it... It was just something you had to do if you wanted to get to Groom."



Property Tax Protest and Appeal Procedures

The law gives property owners the right to protest actions concerning their property tax appraisals. You may follow these appeal procedures if you have a concern about:

- the value placed on your property
- any exemptions that may apply to you
- the cancellation of an agricultural appraisal
- the taxable status of your property
- the local governments which should be taxing your property
- any action taken by the appraisal district that adversely affected you.

Informal Review

Review by the Appraisal Review Board

If you can't resolve your problem informally with the appraisal district staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board (ARB).

The ARB is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals or other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the appraisal district to make the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice of protest) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You'll receive written notice of the time, date and place of the hearing. The hearing will be informal. You and the appraisal district representative will be asked to present evidence about your case. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. You can get a copy of a protest form from the appraisal district office at 102 MAIN STREET, PANHANDLE, TEXAS 79068

Note: You shouldn't try to contact ARB members outside of the hearing. The law requires ARB members to sign an affidavit saying that they haven't talked about your case before the ARB hears it.

Review by the District Court

After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of its order by certified mail. If you're not satisfied with the decision, you have the right to appeal to district court. If you choose to go to court, you must start the process by filing a petition within 45 days of the date you receive the ARB's order. If the appraisal district has appraised your property at \$1,000,000 or more, you must file a notice of appeal with the chief appraiser within 15 days of the date you receive the ARB's order.

You can also get a pamphlet describing how to prepare a protest from the appraisal district or from the State Comptroller's Property Tax Division at 4301 Westbank Drive, Building B, Suite 100, Austin, Texas 78746-6565.

Deadline for Filing Protests with the ARB*

Usual Deadline

On or before May 31 (or 30 days after a notice of appraised value was mailed to you, whichever is later).

Late protests are allowed if you miss the usual deadline for good cause. Good cause is some reason beyond your control, like a medical emergency. The ARB decides whether you have good cause.

Late protests are due the day before the appraisal review board approves records for the year. Contact your appraisal district for more information.

Special Deadlines

For change of use (the appraisal district informed you that you are losing agricultural appraisal because you changed the use of your land), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

For ARB changes (the ARB has informed you of a change that increases your tax liability and the change didn't result from a protest you filed), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

If you believe the appraisal district or ARB should have sent you a notice and did not, you may file a protest until the day before taxes become delinquent (usually February 1). The ARB decides whether it will hear your case based on evidence about whether a required notice was mailed to you.

* The deadline is postponed to the next business day if it falls on a weekend or holiday.

Carson County Sheriff's Report

The Carson County Sheriff's Department investigated a fatal industrial accident at an oilfield site near Skellytown this past Friday. A Borger man was pronounced dead on arrival at Golden Plains Hospital in Borger after being transported from the site. The cause of the death was a massive crushing chest injury. The skellytown Fire and Rescue units were on hand to help extricate the victim from the machinery.

Our Department and the Texas Highway Patrol were called to the west county area on Interstate 40 Friday evening after receiving a call that an off-duty Potter County Sheriff's Department officer was being pursued by other Potter County law officers into our county. The off-duty officer was in possession of firearm and was threatening to shoot himself or others. Our department, the Texas Highway Patrol, Amarillo Police Department and Potter County Sheriff's Department blocked all lanes of I 40 until the weapons and the suspect could be secured through negotiation. No one was injured in the incident. The Potter County Sheriff's Department took custody of the the subject and the matter is being reviewed by their department.

The sheriff's department is currently investigating two unrelated reports of aggravated assault. In one case, the victim was allegedly attacked in the parking lot of a bar in Groom. The victim's injuries may involve permanently impaired vision as the result of repeated blows to the face and head.

We are investigating one case of physical abuse to a child and another matter dealing with an aggravated case of child neglect. These cases are being investigated with the assistance of the Department of Human Services.

The sheriff's department is investigating a home burglary which was reported in Conway. This is the most recent of a series of burglaries that we've had along Interstate 40. While this area may be a prime target to transient thieves, we believe that all the burglaries may be related. If you have witnessed any suspicious persons or activities which may relate to these burglaries, please contact our office.

Our department has requested the assistance of animal cruelty investigators from Amarillo to help us in the investigation into the death of several head of cattle on property near White Deer. In the event that the investigation indicates cruelty to the animal, charges may be filed against the property owner and the remaining animals seized.

Carson County warrants for theft of a hay baler from Groom was located in Vega and returned to Panhandle to await trail.

Deputy Joe Leatherwood responded to a report of a vehicle driving in the wrong lane of traffic on Highway 60 and had to use his patrol car to force the vehicle to stop. After getting the vehicle stopped, the driver was found to be holding a knife in one hand and Deputy Leatherwood had to disarm the man before securing him for arrest. No damage was done to the patrol car of to the suspect's vehicle. The man was

charged with DWI and jailed in Panhandle.

Our department was contacted by the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Police Department regarding harassing telephone calls which were being made to their headquarters in Topeka, Kansas. The calls had been traced to a residence in Panhandle. A suspect in

the case was questioned by our department and a special agent from the Santa Fe Railway Police.

Pool Indicted On Federal Embezzlement Charges

Roy Lynn Pool of Groom was charged with bank fraud in documents filed Friday in the U.S. District Court in Amarillo. This charge stems from an earlier embezzlement investigation conducted by Carson County Sheriff Loren Brand and Sgt. Gary Henderson of the Texas Rangers.

The charging documents allege that Pool obtained an estimated \$200,00 from two financial institutions by forging signatures and altering bank stamps to disguise the identity of the institutions where the checks were deposited.


Pool was then able to

deposit checks into her personal accounts and withdraw funds from those accounts. There are currently charges pending against Pool in 100th District Court in Carson County in addition to the charges filed in U.S. District Court on Friday.







DPS Report

On Sunday May 1, a New Mexico man was arrested on IH - 40, one mile East of Groom for possession of Drug paraphernalia after a search of the vehicle turned up several marihuana seeds and a pipe.

On May 5, Corporal Roland McGill arrested a Borger man in Borger for unpaid DPS ticket totaling \$373.00. The subject was released upon paying the fine. Later that evening a pickup pulling a trailer on IH -40 lost a wheel while traveling east. The wheel from the trailer struck a pickup traveling west on I-40 9 miles west of Groom causing minimal damage. No injuries or citations were reported.

On May 6, a Lubbock woman was arrested for failure to Identify to a police officer on I-40 4 miles west of Groom after

attempting to use someone else's Texas ID card. Further investigation revealed that the woman got the ID card from her friend to get into bars because she was under age. The Id card was seized and turned over to the Drivers License office in Amarillo for further investigation.

One or more persons, possibly our own youth have been breaking the street lamp between RGM and Attebury Grain. SPS estimates that the lamps cost \$100.00 to replace. Therefore, any one caught intentionally breaking the light can be arrested, placed in the Carson County Jail and charged with a Class B misdemeanor, resulting in a maximum of 6 months in jail, a \$1,500. fine or both plus restitution for the light to SPS. Also, if you are standing in the area with a rock in your hand, the intent to cause damage is

there and you can also be charged.

It has also come to our attention, AGAIN, that the Groom Youth are playing tag with their vehicles and speeding in the school zone during their lunch hour and after school. I had the occasion to talk to one of the subjects involved who treated me with no respect and appeared more concerned with putting on eye shadow that the violation she had committed. Also, that same person was later observed hanging out a window shouting vulgar language at a school board member. This is not the way that the youth of Groom, Texas should be acting. This sounds more like inter-city youth of a large metropolitan area. I share some of the blame for talking and warning instead of issue tickets. My responsibility is to enforce the law, not baby sit the kids of Groom.

And now a word from Trooper Davis...

I am very disappointed with some of the things that have been going on. For one, the story written at school about several teachers and my family. Some parts of the story had my wife dead and naked in a bardich. My children had been stabbed and killed. This was written by several of our local teens. Now, this is bad. Maybe some of our parents need to be made aware of this, I don't know if they would believe their children could do such a thing. That hurts when I have tried to get along with our teens and I have tried to help our community. Maybe some of the parents of Groom, need to get out and see what the kids are up to and see for themselves. I know some would some would still say..."Not my kid". If I had treated a law enforcement officer or any adult the way I was treated the other day at school, my parents would have killed me. So all I am saying is that parents of Groom, better wake up and look around. We don't want another tragedy like the one in February. It is not all the kids, only

about 1% of the kids are the problem. We don't want them to mess it up for everyone else.

Ten Named To Route 66 Hall Of Fame

Ten Members were installed into the Route 66 Hall of Fame last weekend. Delbert Trew conducted the ceremonies assisted by Charlie Marie Shurley.

"The purpose of the Rt. 66 Association," said Trew, "is to keep the spirit of the greatest migration of people in America alive."

Born Irene Perry at Graham, Young County, Texas on June 26, 1917. Married Morris Mullanax, February 9, 1937 at Fort Worth, Texas. Moved to Kellerville, Gray County, Texas, where Morris was employed by the Phillips company.

On March 1, 1944, they opened their first business, a serve yourself laundry, on Old Route 66. In 1945, they acquired the hotel from prominent pioneers, Mr. and Mrs. Joe Hindman. In 1947, they opened the Mullanax Men's Store in the hotel building.

In 1959, they sold the hotel, moved the store to 110 north main, and moved to their farm three miles south west of McLean.

They have one son, Gayle, who attended school in McLean.

On January 2, 1964, Morris passed away, and Irene moved back into McLean from the farm, where they still operate the Mullanax store.

Mamie Pool moved to Shamrock in 1920, her father was a farmer and business man. During those early years of the roaring twenties, talk of naming the highway began. Mamie remembers many discussions on this subject. The Sixty Six Oil Company of Barlesville, Oklahoma, was expanding, and building their stations in most towns along this route. Finally, "Route 66" was decided on and was well known and traveled.

Mr. Jimmy McCasland and Mamie have had several restaurants and motels on "Route 66". Spring of 1947, they designed and equipped, "Longhorn Restaurant" on Route 66 in Groom, Texas. In 1949 they bought interest

in "U-Drop-Inn" restaurant in Shamrock, Texas. Mr. McCasland's health gave way and they sold back to the Nunn's and a few years later they purchased "Ranch House Cafe" on Route 66, on the west side of Groom. They also owned and operated the Truck Stop West of the Cafe. Later they bought the small motel across the street.

In 1963 she bought land on Route 66, west side of Vega, Texas and constructed and operated the "Best Western Motel Sands", and also the "Western Skies Restaurant". They leased the cafe to a Mr. and Mrs. Rogers.

Charles F. Weaver was born January 16, 1910 south of McLean, Texas in the Skillet Creek Community. His parents were Mr. and

Mrs. Charley F. Weaver, who were early pioneers of that community.

After finishing high school, Charles farmed and ranched with his dad. His dad passed away in November 1938, after which Charles farmed and ranched for his mother.

In March 1941, Charles married Mary Catherine Dotson of Commerce, Texas, who had been teaching the Skillet Creek School since September 1938. They have one son, Robert Dotson Weaver.

On September 15, 1959, Charles opened the "Charles Weaver Texaco" on the corner of Old 66 East and Commerce Street in McLean, Texas. It was a full service station. Charles was soon to learn that operating a service station from 6:00

a.m. to 9:00 or 10:00 p.m. was not an easy job, but it was rewarding in many ways. He met so many wonderful people. Many returned every year going on their vacations. They got to be like old friends stopping by to visit.

Ted Glass was born April 16, 1904, south of McLean. In the early 40's Ted managed the Phillips station during the war years. Later he and Arthur Dwyer bought the consumer's supply from Truitt Johnson and Clyde Andrews. They worked together there for several years. Then they constructed a building on the south lane of Highway 66.

The building consisted of a filling station, garage, and a small grocery store.

Ted spent many years of

his life working in four different filling stations in McLean and all of them were on Route 66.

T.J. and Una Newsom moved to McLean, Texas in 1948. T.J. opened an automotive shop behind a Texaco Station one block west of main street on Highway 66. He operated the shop until his death on August 20, 1950. Una and six weeks old daughter Vicky Sue stayed in McLean.

Frank Payne and Una Newsom were married in 1956. They leased the Phillips 66 Station on Highway 66, two blocks west of Main Street in 1960 which they operated until 1962.

In 1964 they moved to Shamrock, Texas and bought a truck stop and restaurant on "Old Route 66", which was operated and owned by the Paynes until 1991, when it sold to Mary Garrison.

In 1970 they bought Mafield Auto Parts Store on "Old Route 66", now named Franks Auto Parts. The Parts Store was sold to Kenneth Stokes and Associates in 1992.

Frank and Una bought Panhandle Concrete plant in 1973, naming it Shamrock Concrete. It was managed by Franks' brother Henry

Payne, it was sold to Henry in 1981.
