



**Public Notice**

The Groom exchange has petitioned for Expanded Toll-Free Local Calling to the Pampa and Panhandle exchanges.

Within the next 15 days GTE will mail ballots to all customers in the Groom exchange. After marking the ballot, customers should sign their name and return the ballot to the Public Utility Commission of Texas. A stamped self addressed envelope will be provided with the ballot.

Expanded Toll-Free Local Calling will allow customers in the Groom exchange to call and be called by customers in the Pampa and Panhandle exchanges. If approved, all subscribers in the Groom exchange will be charged an additional monthly per line charge up to \$3.50 for residence and \$7.00 for business. This charge is in addition to your local exchange service rates, and will apply until GTE's next general rate case, at which time all service rates are subject to change. These charges are the maximum that can be charged regardless of the number of exchanges that are approved by the voters in the Groom exchange.

Expanded Toll-Free Local Calling will be granted to each exchange with a "Yes" vote from 70% of the people who actually return their ballots. Exchanges that fail to receive a 70% "Yes" vote will not be added to the local calling scope. If all exchanges fail to meet the requirements of the ballot, service will not change and customers will not be billed an additional monthly fee.

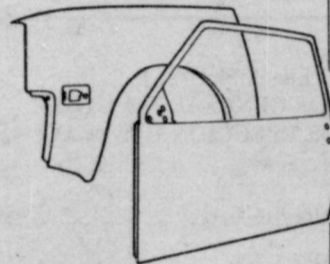

March 5th - A Lark man was arrested for DWI-1st offence on IH-40 Business

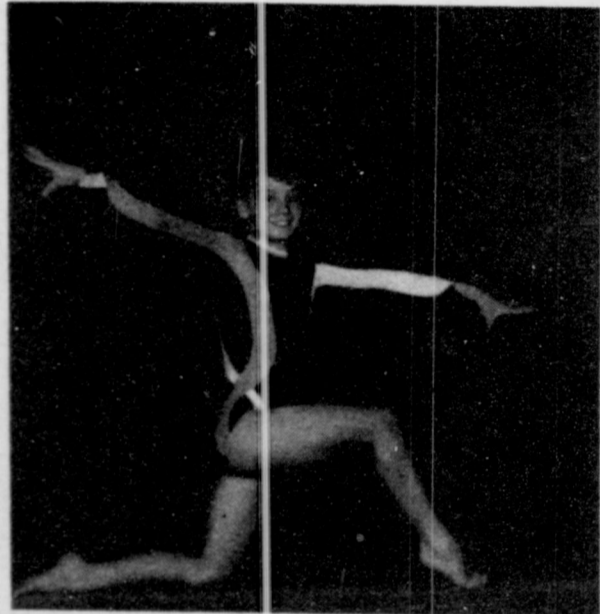

## Board Tables Gym Discussion Rutherford, Holland Resign

The McLean School Board has, again, tabled discussion on the feasibility of a new gym. Page and Associates Contractors were scheduled to meet with the board during the regular meeting on March 8th. Unfortunately, they were unable to attend. Permissions was granted by the General Services Commission to sell two school buses, a 65 passenger '81 Chevrolet and a 48 passenger '82 Ford. They will be sold in Canyon on April 30.

Superintendent Lamb reported that the rent on the Alanreed house is being paid.

A discussion was held concerning the Alanreed gym. Frank Sparring will continue to maintain the grounds and the key policy will remain the same.

Sponsorship of extra curricular activities were discussed, specifically the cheerleader sponsor. The possibility of providing a stipend for these employees was discussed but tabled until Superintendent Lamb could provide a list of these employees.

All motions were unanimous.

Reassignments were made to fill positions for the remainder of the school year. Superintendent Lamb will act as high school principal as well as his other duties. Anna Miller will serve as high school secretary.

Discussion was held concerning school credit cards. Superintendent Lamb was instructed to obtain a multi-purpose card for school use.

The meeting adjourned at 9:07 pm.

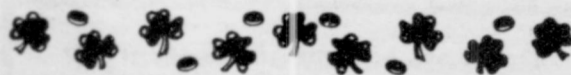

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR LICENSING, INVESTIGATION, FEES AND PERMITS OF PEDDLING**

City Council of City of Groom amended Ordinance #70, regarding to itinerant merchants (vendors) to include the following changes:

Before the City will issue a peddling license, the peddling individual or organization shall make application for investigation at the City Hall of the City of Groom. The cost for this is \$50.00 non-refundable.

Upon completion of the investigation, a permit shall be issued upon payment of the following permit fees: \$15.00 per day; \$75.00 per month; \$250.00 per year.

Any person peddling within the limits of the City of Groom, Texas, without a valid license, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum of not less than \$10.00 and not to exceed \$1,000.00.

Peddling - selling or offering for sale consumer goods, as hereinafter defined, directly to the consumer at a residence of place of business.

Consumer Goods - Food, produce and other perishables and consumables, manufactured or hand-crafted items, books, magazines and other publication, works of art, decorative items, perfume, jewelry, tree, shrubs and other vegetation and domestic or wild animals, but excluding a farmers own produce.

We ask all citizens to be aware of peddlers or vendors in town. If they come to your house, ask to see their license from the City of Groom. If they do not have this then ask the peddler to go to City Hall first before purchasing a product.
