City Water Distribution System Facing Costly Problems

The City of Groom is facing some potentially costly problems with the present water distribution system and will soon be forced to make improvements to the water infrastructure. In an effort to buy down on the cost of those improvements for the residents of the City of Groom, city staff members are now in the process of developing an application for state grant funds, which,

if funded, will pay a substantial portion of those improvements costs, eliminating the need to obligate future revenues or increase user fees.

The Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) annually receives funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Part of this money is allocated regionally through the Texas Community Development

Program (TCDP) to help cities and counties like Groom to address key community development needs. Unfortunately, the Panhandle's TCDP allocation is never large enough to fund the many grant requests made each year by local governments in the Panhandle, so the process has become very competitive. Successful applicants are determined by a point system set up by a two-tiered scoring procedure. Half of the score is determined by TDHCA staff. All of the factors used in the scoring process are based on a predetermined set of criteria, and the applicants vying for the funds will have been made aware of which factors will be used in advance of the preparation of their applications. To the extent possible, the applicants will take advantage of every scoring opportunity possible in order to improve their chances of being selected as one of the fortunate few which will receive the grant funding.

One of the primary objectives of this program is to improve public facilities to meet basic human needs, principally for persons of low and moderate income. To that end, the City must show that at least 51 percent of the persons which benefit from the proposed project will be persons whose income is 80 percent or less of the

median income in Carson County. Since the water project will benefit the entire Groom Community, that threshold percentage of 51 percent must be determined for the whole community in order to meet eligibility requirements.

There are two methods involved in determining the threshold percentage. The first is to analyze census data using a methodology prescribed by TDHCA. If this analysis shows that at least 51 percent of the City's residents are of low to moderate income, then the City does not need to pursue the second stage, but the analysis of census data for the City of Groom shows the low/mod income percentage as 43.79. Through the census-based method is a valid means of deriving this income percentage, it tends to underestimate the actual numbers, and so TDHCA offers another method.

The other method is much more entailed but is much more accurate. This method involves a brief survey, taken door-to-door, of all the households in Groom. The survey includes nine questions and takes about two or three minutes to complete.

Given the pressing situation involved with the water system, the City of Groom has decided to apply for TCDP funding this year. In order to be eligible, the City must conduct this City-

The Groom Tigers scrimmaged their old rivals the Claude Mustangs last week.

"We made some adjustments that we felt were necessary," stated Coach Steve Lott, "While we still are making some mental errors that come from lack of experience, the team has come a long way."

Justin Ritter had a very good night both as an offensive tail back and a defensive back. Brandon Crump did an excellent job as a guard making several tackles.

Offensively, the Tigers ran the ball very well. According to Lott, the thing that needs the most improvement is the passing game.

"We had an excellent practice Monday night," said Lott. "We are refocusing and getting ready to face Valley."

Groom Tigers open the 1995 football season this Friday in Valley. Valley Patriots begin their second season, as do the Groom Tigers, in the eleven-man game, small but determined. Valley compiled a 1994 record of 2-8. Valley opened the season against



Waste Collection Scheduled At White Deer

Remember to mark September 9 on your calendar. That's the day that the City of White Deer will be conducting a special collection event for waste tires and old car batteries.

The event will be held on the parking lot of White

Deer Parts in White Deer between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Residents throughout Carson County are invited to participate in this collection event.

The City of White Deer is sponsoring this event with

the help of White Deer Parts, Safe Tire Disposal Corp. of Midland and the Interstate Battery System of Amarillo. Since tires and batteries can no longer be legally buried in landfills, the City wants to provide residents with a convenient means of disposing of these

items. Collection events such as the one being held by the City are just about the only acceptable avenue available for getting rid of unwanted tires and batteries. Unfortunately, the opportunities to sponsor such events will become less frequent during the next several years due to legislative changes in the

state's tire recycling program. The tires and batteries will be accepted for recycling at no charge to the participants.

The list of items that can be accepted at this event will include:

- Automotive lead acid batteries from a car, truck or pick-up. No other type of battery can be accepted at this event.
- Vehicle tires that have been removed from the rim. Businesses that bring tires in for recycling should be prepared to provide a manifest for the tires they are dropping off.
