Rain Comes Too Late To Save Dry Land Wheat ...

Moisture Forecasts Good Fall Crops

Groom has been saturated by heavy rains over the last two weeks. But, luckily most of the severe weather has passed it by.

Two weeks ago, a small tornado destroyed a barn that belonged to Darlene Jones and did some other damage to a nearby sprinkler system.

For the most part, the really severe weather has been to the north and east

of Groom in neighboring White Deer and McLean. Both have, at different times, received hail nearing golf ball size and extremely high winds with the threat of tornados.

Groom weather watchers sounded the siren in the early morning hours about three weeks ago, mostly to alert sleeping residents that tornadic activity was possible.

Our "unofficial"

weatherman, Breeze Kuehler, states that we have had about 1.52 inches of rain in June and 3.91 inches of rain in late May.

Tony Treadwell of Attebury Grain stated, "The rain has come too late to be of much benefit to the wheat crop. Most dry land (wheat) has been "disastered out" and plowed under. The irrigated wheat is doing alright but we are beginning to see some sprout damage near the Wichita Falls area.

We could see some of that here if the dampness persists."

"This is the third year in a row for wheat farmers to hit bad luck," stated Janelle Sustaire of Wheeler Evans. "The last good wheat crop we had was in 1992. The rain will help our fall crops, Milo and Corn."

Most corn farmers have their crops in the field. While the plants could use a day or two of sunshine, the moisture has come slow

enough in most places to replace the seriously depleted underground moisture.

In the recent week the Groom area has received from 3-5 inches. In the Corners vicinity, they have accumulated about 8 inches. In the Grandview-Hopkins area 6 to 8 inches is the estimate. Forecasters are expecting more rain towards the end of the week for the area.

Fields Wins Gold, Homer Silver At State Piano Competition

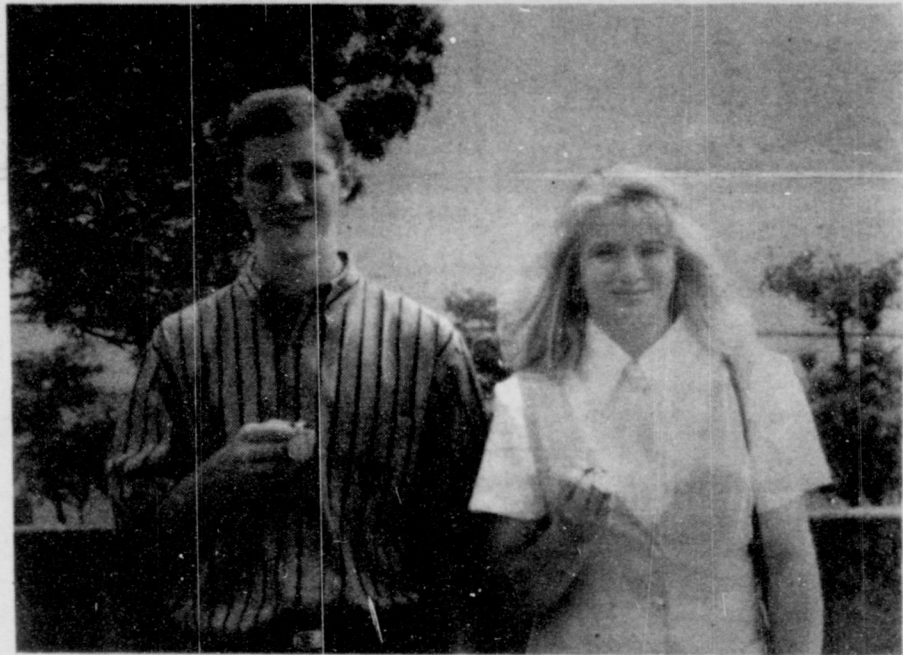
Stacy Jean Fields, a recent graduate of Groom High School, competed in the State Piano Solo Contest and was awarded a 1st division and gold medal.

Mutual Aid Agreement Revised, City Volunteers Accept Delivery On Pantex Surplus Ambulance

The Groom Ambulance Department President Jay Lamb, City Alderman R. C. Cornett were in Panhandle on Wednesday morning to accept delivery of a surplus ambulance from Pantex Officials.

The Ambulance Department and the City of Groom have been working through the Carson County Judge's office to procure a surplus ambulance from the Pantex Plant for quite sometime.

According to County Officials, the process was delayed do to the way the Mutual aid agreement was worded.

"I had a meeting with some of their people today (Tuesday)," stated Carson County Judge Jay Bob Roselius. "We have had to rewrite part of the Mutual Aid Agreement in order to accommodate a loan of equipment of this type. With every thing in place things moved pretty fast."

"The ambulance will be donated to Carson County because it is the entity who has the Mutual Aid Agreement with Pantex," he continued. "Then, Carson County will loan it to the City of Groom."

The ambulance will be brought into compliance and

insured at the expense of the Groom Ambulance Department. It is unknown at this time exactly what that will entail.

"It may just be a matter of getting it licenced and putting in our radios," stated President Jay Lamb. "At this time we don't know just how much money will need to be spent on it."

The Ambulance Department is hosting a fund raiser this Sunday, for the purpose of establishing a fund to work toward the purchase of a new ambulance. This will be a matching fund for a grant that the Department has

applied to help with the purchase of a new vehicle.

Seven times over the last year the current ambulance has been in the shop for repairs, creating a real need for reliable transportation.

City Council members discussed at their last meeting their reasoning for not purchasing an ambulance at this time.

"The recent 1/2 cent sale tax increase will not go into effect until October. It will then take a year to see just how much actual money will be in the fund. The amount must be budgeted before it can be spent.

Sheriff's Report**

Carson County Sheriff's deputies were kept busy with storm-related activities during the week. Our office had numerous calls regarding portions of Farm to Market and state highways that were flooded, possible tornado sightings and property that was damaged due to high winds. One area of U.S. 207 north of Panhandle and a portion of FM 2385 received so much hail that the roads had to be bladed to keep traffic from sliding on the ice.

The Sheriff's Department recovered a car west of Panhandle which had been stolen from Amarillo. Panhandle police officer Gary Robertson located the suspects in Panhandle.

Our department received a complaint regarding threatening or harassing telephone calls. Sheriff's deputies are also investigating an incident of impersonating a peace officer which occurred at a business on Interstate 40. One subject attempted to use fraudulent credentials to intimidate and harass one of the business employees. Information on a possible suspect in the case is being investigated.

The Sheriff's Department assisted Northwest Texas Hospital's Medivac I in the emergency transfer of a critical patient. The transfer involved the blocking of U.S. 207 to allow for a safe landing of the helicopter and immediate care for the patient. The Texas Department of Highways assisted in the landing.

We would like to remind county residents that the 9-1-1 system is to be used for emergencies only. To make use of the 9-1-1 number for requests for road conditions or to call in non-emergency complaints ties up the telephone lines for persons who are counting on getting immediate attention in life-threatening situations. Lately, we've had more abuse of the 9-1-1 system

by adults than we normally do with children playing with the telephone. If we are going to have a system that works, we're going to need your help by using 9-1-1 only for emergencies.

Deputy Jeff Oldham is investigating the Aggravated Assault of a Conway resident. The victim was taken by personal car to Amarillo for medical treatment. A warrant has been issued for the assailant for Aggravated Assault.
