Carson County Junior Livestock Show Faces Economic Woes

The Carson County Jr. Livestock Show and Sale is just around the corner, January 26 and 27. The annual event will be attended by county wide FFA and 4-H members who will compete against each other for top honors exhibiting Heifers, Steers, Lambs and Pigs.

The judging will begin on at 9:00 am on Friday morning with the heifers followed by the lambs and

then steers. The pig show will begin at 8:00 am on Saturday morning. The sale will begin at 6:00 pm.

The premium sale will be operating under a severe handicap this year. With the sale of Wheeler Evans, a large empty spot has appeared concerning the funding for buying the children's animals. Every town in Carson County has been affected by the sale since Wheeler Evans had

businesses in each city. Other businesses in the area have pledged to do what they can to make up what has been lost, but with the hard economic times everyone has been facing it will be extremely difficult.

Officials are expecting approximately 134 animals to be sold at the event. They invite anyone interested to donate what ever they can. Money from these type of donations will

be pooled to help with the purchase price of an animal, so even a small donation can be significant.

If you would like to donate to the Stock Show Buyers Club, contact Tony Treadwell or Joe Homer in Groom. They also welcome you to come over to Panhandle to see the animals that these youngsters have spent a good part of the year caring for and working with.

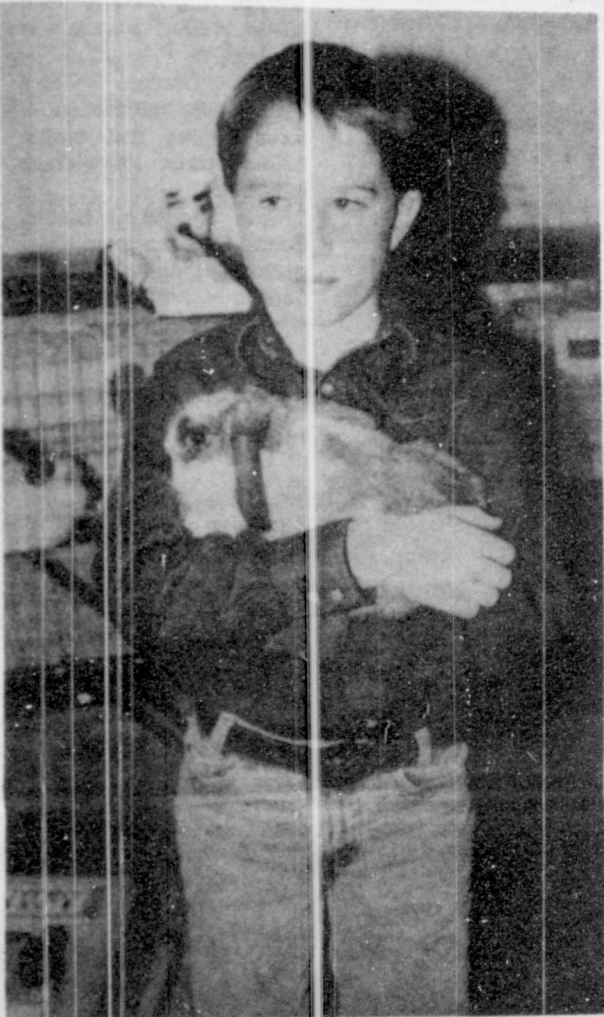

The minutes of the December 14, 1995 regular board meeting were read and approved.

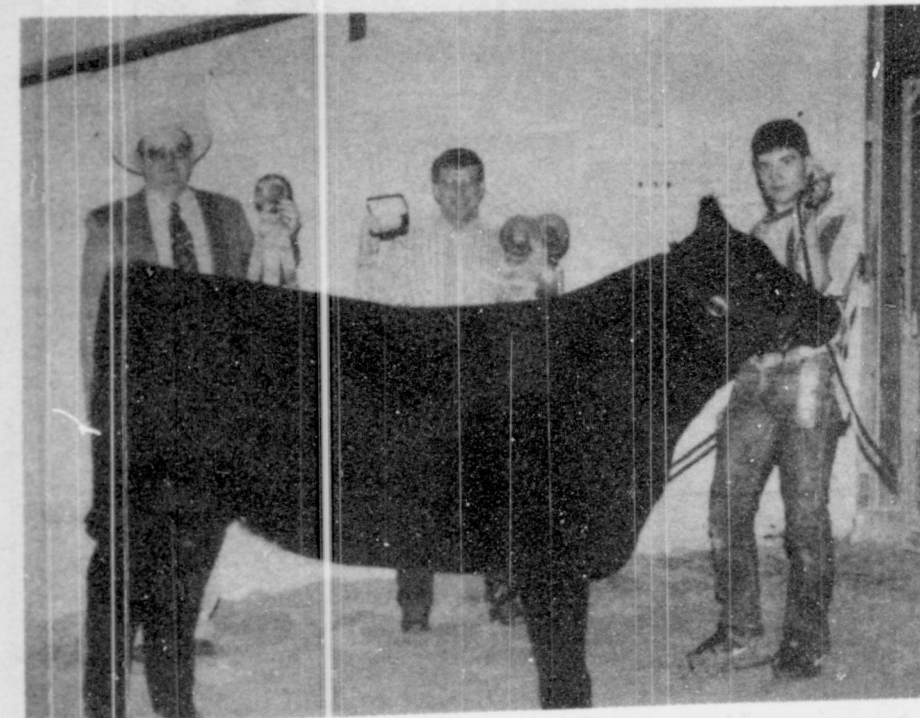

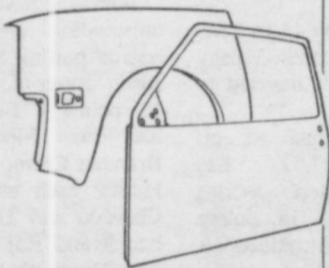

 A City Ordinance prohibiting drilling in the City Limits was passed.

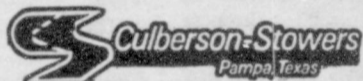

Carson County Deputy, Jeff Oldham Seizes \$9,000.00 After The Arrest Of A Federal Fugitive

By Loren Brand, Sheriff Investigation into Deputy Jeff Oldham's arrest of a federal fugitive has given the U.S. marshal's office information on the identity of a second fugitive wanted on federal charges. District Attorney Randall Sims is assisting our department

with the seizure and potential forfeiture of the nearly \$9,000.00 in cash that was recovered from the suspect. If the forfeiture is successful, we intend to use the proceeds to purchase and train a narcotics detection dog. We've had many calls from parents and

educators who have expressed concern about the increasing use of drugs by school age children. We believe that the use of a drug dog will enable us to become more proactive in controlled substance cases. Sgt. Ray Davis and Deputy Larry Mendez were

called to the Fritch area to investigate an altercation involving nearly twenty juveniles. One juvenile was taken into custody after allegedly pointing a shotgun at other persons involved in the argument. One person received facial injuries after being struck with a hockey

stick and at least one person complained of injuries resulting from the use of a pepper spray by another combatant. Officers recovered several cans of pepper spray and our investigation continues into reports of one juvenile threatening others with a pistol.

Deputy Mendez and Sgt. Davis were called to the Pantex facility when two intoxicated persons attempted to enter the property. The Pantex Security Force stopped the suspects from gaining entrance and held them for our officers.

Our department assisted the Police Department at the scene of a possible drug overdose in Panhandle. One person was transported to Amarillo for emergency care. Reports of a man screaming in Groom were investigated and it was determined that the source was Sgt. Ray "Colombo" Davis who had just turned FIFTY.

Chief Deputy Lovell Kennard and Sgt. Davis were called to the Antelope Creek area near Fritch when a Hutchinson County deputy sheriff was assaulted just inside the Carson County line. One person was taken into custody and incarcerated in our county. Arresting officers also found a small amount of marijuana in the possession of the suspect.

McLean Will Get Chance To Vote On Extended Calling

City Council members voted unanimously last week to start a petition to the Public Utilities Commission to add Pampa, Wheeler, Shamrock, Clarendon and Amarillo as local numbers for McLean.

Assistant City Secretary Toni Bohler indicated that officials from Southwestern Bell Telephone Company indicated that it would be unlikely that Amarillo be allowed as a local number because it is considered out of range, but city officials decided to ask for the service anyway.

Pampa is also considered out of range, but Bohler said McLean could likely still receive the service because Pampa is the county seat and has the closest major medical facility.
The city must collect signatures from either five percent of its population or 100 people to be considered for the service. PUC then turns over the petition to the telephone company, which then sends out ballots to residents.
The balloting must collect 70 percent yes votes for the service to be allowed. If

the voting drive fails, McLean must wait another 18 months to try again.

The service would cost residents an extra \$3.50 per month and businesses an extra \$7 per month, but city councilmen said they felt those costs were minimal in comparison to long distance bills.

Bohler will serve as petition coordinator.

In other action at the Thursday night meeting, the council decided to file a petition of complaint against local resident Decie Pool.

Pool, the city alleges, has at least 50 uncontrolled cats in her two homes in the city.

Councilman Gary Jackson said he attributed the number of uncontrolled cats in the entire town to his recent bout with cat scratch fever, an illness which required surgery to remove a lymph node.

Jackson told the council he contacted the Texas Department of Health on Pool's case. The department has launched its



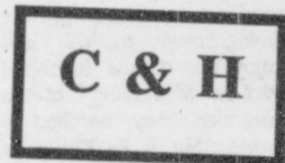
