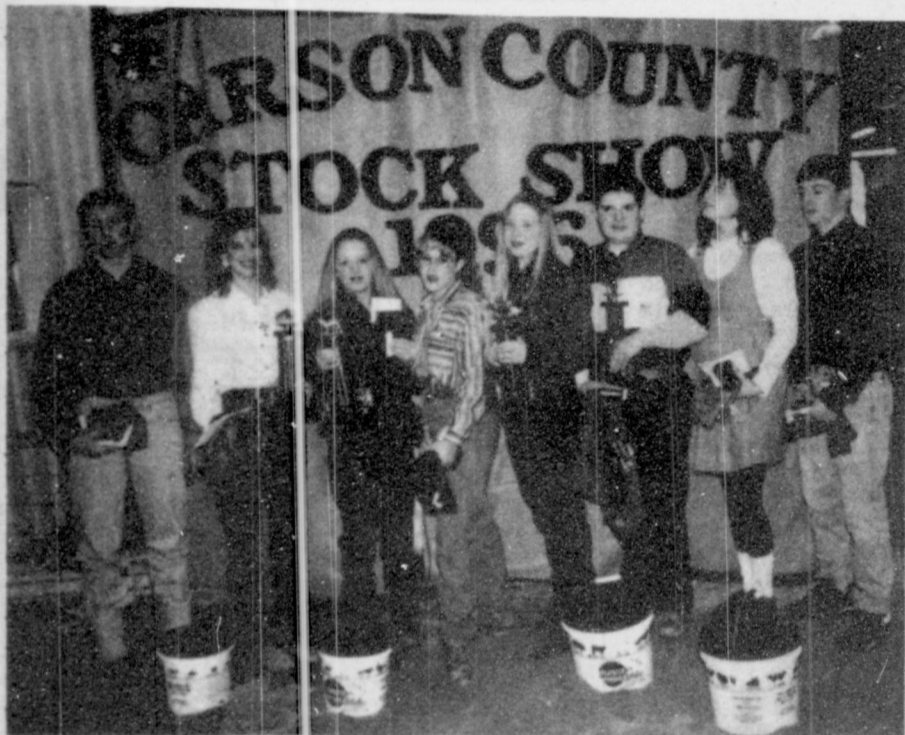

In the heifer show, April Burton's entry was named Grand Champion and Scott McLaughlin earned Reserve Champion honors. McLaughlin also earned the showmanship award from among all the beef exhibitors.

Kayla Blount of White Deer, FFA won the Grand Champion Lamb Show. Terra Carnes of White Deer won the Reserve Grand Championship. Blount also won the senior showmanship award for lambs. Pam Bednorz of Panhandle won the Jr. showmanship award.

Jennifer Norton of White Deer won the Grand Champion Pig honors with her entry. Reserve Grand Champion was Dale Adams, also of White Deer. Jennifer Norton won the senior showmanship award and Byron Norton won the junior showmanship award.

Erik Vance of Panhandle earned the junior showmanship for the beef

category.

"Rookie of the Year" is awarded to any first time showman no matter what they show. This years award went to Emily Wischaemper of Panhandle.

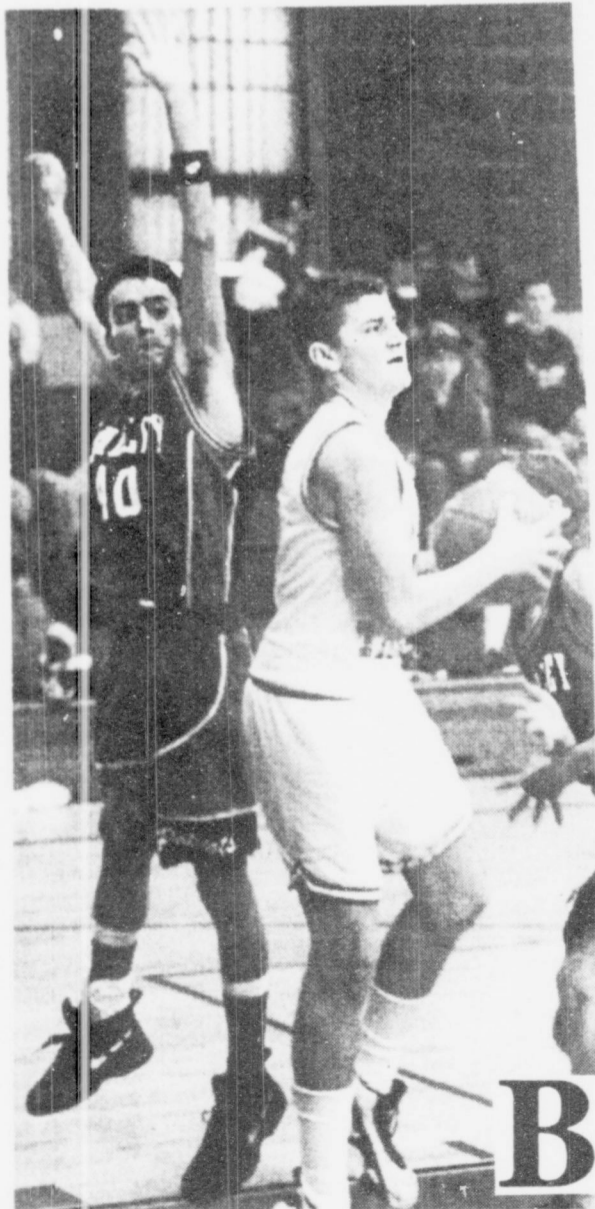

### As the Interstate Turns... Local Troopers Make Several Drug Possession Arrests Along Interstate 40

Hello everyone! This last week was very interesting. I call this chapter 'smokem' if you got 'em.  
The story begins on Sunday, January 21st when two men from Shamrock were arrested on I-40, one

mile east of Groom, for Drug Paraphernalia after a traffic stop led to a search of the vehicle. Both subjects were fined \$240.00 each.  
On Tuesday, January 23rd Trooper Davis arrested a Claude man on issuing a

resulted in the finding of a pipe with marijuana residue. Also on the same day a New Mexico man was arrested on I-40, 2 miles west of Groom, for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. All three men appeared before Judge Hinson and were required to pay a \$240.00 fine. If they were unable to pay they got to meet Sheriff Brand for dinner.

On Thursday, January 25th an Arkansas man was arrested on I-40, three miles west of Groom, for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. Later that afternoon an Illinois duo was arrested on I-40, one mile east of Groom, after a search of their vehicle resulted in the finding of seven marijuana pipes and

seeds. Also arrested were two Oklahoma men coming back from a trip to California where they picked up some very decorative pipes that they tested by smoking marijuana. All five of these people were fined \$240.00.

Seven vehicle searches resulted in the finding of over 20 pieces of drug paraphernalia and ten arrests. The Department of Public Safety has zero tolerance on the use of illegal drugs. This is just the tip of the ice burg. To be continued...
