Annual Earnings Repor Due April 15
If you are one of the 1.3 million people who work while receiving monthly Social Security benefits, and you earn more than the annual limit, you will need to call or visit a Social Security office to file your annual earnings report no later than April 15, 1996.

The annual earnings limits for 1995 were $\$ 8,160$ for people under age 65 and $\$ 11,280$ for people age 65-69. (The earnings limit for 1996 are $\$ 8,280$ for people under 65 and $\$ 11,520$ for people $65-69$.) The limits do not apply to people age 70 and older.

You can report your earnings by telephone or by completing an Annua Report of Earnings form This form is available by calling or visiting your Social Security office.
