## New Faces Elected to City, School Boards

Groom voters went to the polls Saturday and elected to make some changes for the City as well as School Board.

In the City election Don Case received the largest number of votes with 117. Jay Lamb netted 112 votes, Mary Sue Lyles had 109 and R.E. Cornett had 69. Alderman Hop Britten and Martin Hermesmyer left two of the three seats open when they chose not to seek re-election.

Case, Lamb and Lyles will be sworn in at the next regular meeting, which will be held this Friday, May 10.

In the School Board election Steve Anthony received 149 votes, Tony Treadwell 116, and Jody Ball 101. One of the two seats was made available when Trustee Gary Davis chose to retire from the position. Anthony and Treadwell were sworn in at a special called meeting Tuesday morning.

## Rabies Clinic Set For Saturday At Fire Department

This is a reminder to all pet owners that the Annual Rabies Clinic will be held this Saturday in the Groom Fire Hall. It is a state law that all dogs and cats must be vaccinated yearly against rabies.

Texas is currently under a rabies quarantine. Pet owners can be held liable if their animals are not vaccinated.

Also at this time, Animal Control Officer, Donna Burton would like to remind all dog owners that it is illegal to allow dogs to run at large, day or night. Patrol will be made at all hours and any dog found running loose will be cited. Parents should caution their children that when they play with their pets, they cannot go off leaving the animal out. Children also like to take walks with their dogs. Please remind them that they must put the animal on a leash.

The dog must be under control at all times. If you let the dog out to go to the bathroom, you must be with it and not allow it to roam to other peoples yards.





**Property Tax Protest and Appeal Procedures**

The law gives property owners the right to protest actions concerning their property tax appraisals. You may follow these appeal procedures if you have a concern about:

- the value placed on your property
- any exemptions that may apply to you
- the cancellation of an agricultural appraisal
- the taxable status of your property
- the local governments which should be taxing your property
- any action taken by the appraisal district that adversely affected you.

**Review by the Appraisal Review Board**  
If you can't resolve your problem informally with the appraisal district staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board (ARB).

The ARB is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals or other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the appraisal district to make the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice of protest) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You'll receive written notice of the time, date and place of the hearing. The hearing will be informal. You and the appraisal district representative will be asked to present evidence about your case. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. You can get a copy of a protest form from the appraisal district office at 102 MAIN STREET, PANHANDLE, TEXAS 79068

Note: You shouldn't try to contact ARB members outside of the hearing. The law requires ARB members to sign an affidavit saying that they haven't talked about your case before the ARB hears it.

**Review by the District Court**  
After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of its order by certified mail. If you're not satisfied with the decision, you have the right to appeal to district court. If you choose to go to court, you must start the process by filing a petition within 45 days of the date you receive the ARB's order. If the appraisal district has appraised your property at \$1,000,000 or more, you must file a notice of appeal with the chief appraiser within 15 days of the date you receive the ARB's order.

**Deadline for Filing Protests with the ARB\***

**Usual Deadline**  
On or before May 31 (or 30 days after a notice of appraised value was mailed to you, whichever is later).

Late protests are allowed if you miss the usual deadline for good cause. Good cause is some reason beyond your control, like a medical emergency. The ARB decides whether you have good cause.

Late protests are due the day before the appraisal review board approves records for the year. Contact your appraisal district for more information.

**Special Deadlines**  
For change of use (the appraisal district informed you that you are losing agricultural appraisal because you changed the use of your land), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

For ARB changes (the ARB has informed you of a change that increases your tax liability and the change didn't result from a protest you filed), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

If you believe the appraisal district or ARB should have sent you a notice and did not, you may file a protest until the day before taxes become delinquent (usually February 1). The ARB decides whether it will hear your case based on evidence about whether a required notice was mailed to you.

\* The deadline is postponed to the next business day if it falls on a weekend or holiday.





On Friday, May 3rd, Mrs. Adams' and Mrs. Greer's second and third grade classes participated in an afternoon rodeo.




