## Adopted Appraisal District, County Budgets Reviewed

Carson County and Carson County Appraisal District recently met and adopted budgets for 1998. The following is a brief outline of estimated expenditures. Keep in mind that a budget is an educated guess at what each entity plans to spend. It does not have unforeseen expenses that come up. When these things happen, readers will see where the governing boards will amend the budget in their monthly minutes.

The Carson County Appraisal District adopted a budget of \$241,365 for 1998. Included in the budget are \$125,515 in salaries, car allowance, insurance and other benefits. Other expenses such as building maintenance, legal services, collection costs, and utilities make up the bulk of the rest. The only other large expenses are \$31,100 for valuation engineers and 24,090 for Data Processing.

The County Budget is very complex. There are many different categories. Below is a brief summary of what is in each one including the salary of elected officials.

Under the General Fund heading:

**COMMISSIONERS COURT** - Budgeted \$101,775.00 includes monies for tax appraisal district, Conference & Education, Museum attendant salary, Health Insurance, plus Judge's car allowance of \$4,800., other benefit costs, advertising, and other miscellaneous expenses.

**COUNTY AUDITOR** - Budgeted 44,510.00

includes county auditor salary of \$29,848. plus \$200 mileage, computer related costs, office supplies plus health and retirement benefits, phone and postage.

**RECORDS PRESERVATION** - budgeted \$16,000.00 includes only those expenses involved in preserving records.

**GENERAL ELECTIONS** - Budgeted \$7,526, includes salaries for judges and clerks, ballot printing, and supplies.

**JUDICIAL AND LAW** - Budgeted \$262,250, including a salary of \$21,539 for Justice of the Peace #1; \$21,539 for

Justice of the Peace #2; and \$17,653 for Justice of the Peace #4. Also includes court costs paid to state, salaries for part time help for JP's #1 & #2, health and retirement benefits, office expenses and other related expenses.

**EXTENSION SERVICE** - Budgeted \$70,116.00 includes salaries for extension agent \$9,828, home economist \$9,828, clerk and part-time help, employee benefits, car allowances, computer expenses, pick up maintenance and stock show expense.

**PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS** - Budgeted \$287,510 includes salaries and benefits for 2 custodians, utilities and repairs on the Courthouse, War Memorial Building, Museum, Agriculture Building, the Groom Justice of the Peace office and Groom DPS office, Libraries, including the construction of a new library in White Deer; Social Services witch include indigent care and legal expenses, autopsies, and

## Eagles Defeated 49-12

The Groom Tigers trounced the Three-Way Eagles last Saturday in a fantastic game at Cotton Center, 49-12.

Three boys had one of their best games ever according to Coach Larry Reid. Dean Fields, Wade Ritter and Toby Burgin all showed great leadership and were a deciding factor in the victory.

Dean rushed 11 times for 86 yards and two touchdowns. He also had two kick off returns for 36 yards and 3 unassisted tackles.

Wade Ritter had 15 carries for 185 yards rushing and two touchdowns. He had four unassisted tackles.

Toby Burgin carried

the ball six times for 63 yards and one touchdown. He had one fumble recovery and 15 unassisted tackles.

Dusty Crump gave the Tigers the other touchdown when he recovered a fumble in the end zone.

As a total, Groom had 17 first downs and 338 yards rushing. Three-Way had 7 first downs and 117 yards.

"Our defensive and offensive lines did an awesome job of blocking this week. It was probably the best blocking we have done all year long," stated Coach Reid.

Russell Conrad and Josh Evenson also carried the ball. Conrad had 2 carries for 12 yards and

1 unassisted tackle and Evenson had 1 carry.

Evenson, who quarterbacks for the Tigers also had 1 pass for 5 yards.

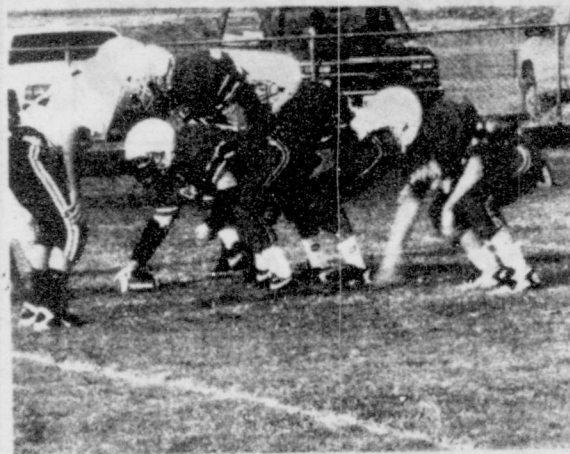
"We really did not have to implement our passing game," said Reid, "With the kind of blocking we were doing and their defense made it unnecessary."

Wyatt Weinheimer received that one pass gaining 5 yards. He also had a quarterback sack and 2 unassisted tackles.

Evan Crowell had 10 unassisted tackles and 2 quarterback sacks.

Jimmy Chavado had 2 unassisted tackles and one quarterback sack.

**COUNTY WIDE** - Budgeted \$96,335. includes salaries for assorted E.M.C. employee benefits, ambulance services, soil conservation, county printing, DPS equipment, office supplies and mileage.

**COUNTY JUDGE** - Budgeted \$83,938 includes Judge's salary of \$37,125 plus mileage and meals of \$1,200 and Secretary salaries, employee benefits, office

supplies, and telephone.

**COUNTY AND DISTRICT CLERK** - Budgeted \$122,296 includes salary for county/district clerk of \$29,848 and two deputies, employee benefits, office supplies, phone, computer leases, court costs paid to the state, recording and indexing fees, and insurance for errors and omissions.

**COUNTY ATTORNEY** - Budgeted \$69,107 includes salaries for county attorney of \$29,848 plus \$300 car

allowance and secretary, employee benefits, office supplies, and law library fees.

**TAX ASSESSOR-COLLECTOR** - Budgeted \$124,164 includes salary for Assessor-Collector of \$29,848 and \$1,600 in car expense and two deputies salaries, plus part time and subcontractors fees, employee benefits, records preservations, advertising, office supplies, data processing, computer enhancement, title search expenses, and bond premium.

**TREASURER** - Budgeted \$47,723 includes treasurer's salary of \$29,848, employee benefits, office supplies, computer related fees, and published reports.

**COUNTY SHERIFF** - Budgeted \$490,861 includes sheriff salary of \$29,848 and deputies salaries, employee benefits, utilities and office expenses, car maintenance, new cars, boarding prisoners, jail maintenance, ammunition, crime scene equipment and teletype maintenance.

**LIBRARY** - Budgeted \$151,632 includes librarian salary of \$20,152, assistant librarian and part-time librarian salaries, employee benefits, office

supplies, telephone and utilities at all branches, books and subscriptions.

**JURY** - Budgeted \$48,881 includes salaries for County Judge of \$1,800 and the salary for the District Judge of \$1,800 as part of the Juvenile Board budget, Court Coordinator, Court Reporter, And the District Attorney's secretary, employee benefits, postage, repairs, travel expenses for the Court Coordinator, Court Reporter expenses, pay

for Grand, District Court, County Court, and Justice of the Peace Jurors, Juvenile Probation Office and visiting Judges pay.

**CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS / MAINTENANCE/EQUIPMENT** - Budgeted \$29,000 for county improvements and office equipment.

In the different precincts the following has been budgeted.

**Precinct #1** - Budgeted \$131,267.00 which includes commissioner salary of \$23,638 and a car allowance of 3,600; plus road hands salaries, employee benefits, liability insurance and equipment payments.

**Precinct #2** - Budgeted \$112,942 which includes commissioner salary of \$23,638 plus car allowance of \$3,600; salaries for road hands, benefits, liability insurance, and equipment payments.

**Precinct #3** - budgeted \$139,194 including salary of \$23,638 for the commissioners plus car allowance of \$3,600; salaries for road hands, benefits, liability insurance, and equipment payments.

**Precinct #4** - Budgeted \$142,609, including commissioner's salary of \$23,638 plus \$3,600 car allowance; road hands salary, liability insurance and equipment payments.

The tax rate set by the County Commissioners Court was set at .32287. This is down slightly from last years .3613. According to County Judge Jay Roselius, this is down due to the increase in the county

wide valuations which were mostly in the oil and gas business.

The net requirements to cover the general fund budget expense was \$2,053,149. Estimated receipts of \$654,013 will help fund a portion of the cost while the tax

effort will generate \$1,376,815. and a balance of \$22,320 will come from the reserve fund," stated Roselius.

The Cubs opened the scoring on a 33 yard touchdown pass from Garrett Britten to Clay Ritter. Ritter added the extra point run for a 7-0 lead. Follett answered with a 31 yard touchdown run with 25 seconds left in the first quarter but the extra point failed to make the score 7-6. In the second quarter Ritter scored again with a 39 yard run and the extra point failed to leave the tally at 13-6. Follett answered with a touchdown pass of 12 yards and the extra point failed so the count was now 13-12. In the third quarter Troy Britten caused a Follett fumble and Wyatt Britten returned the fumble 3 yards for a touchdown. Cody Bivens added the PAT run to give the Cubs a 20-12 lead. 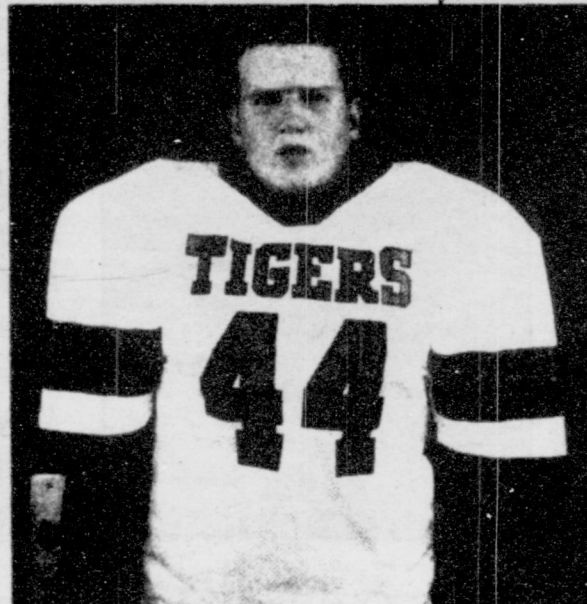

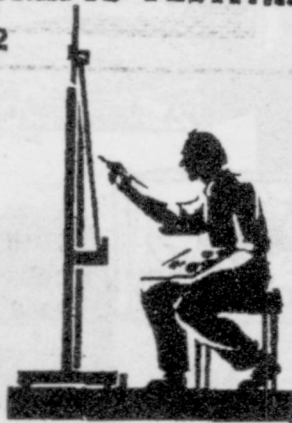


