The Groom Pool opened this week with 48 swimmers in attendance on the very first day.

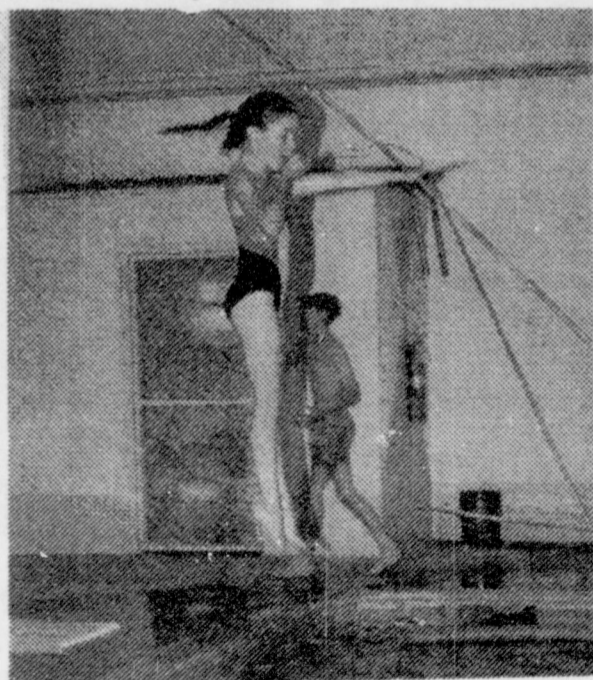
Carrie Sue Davis and Skye Brown are the lifeguards in charge.

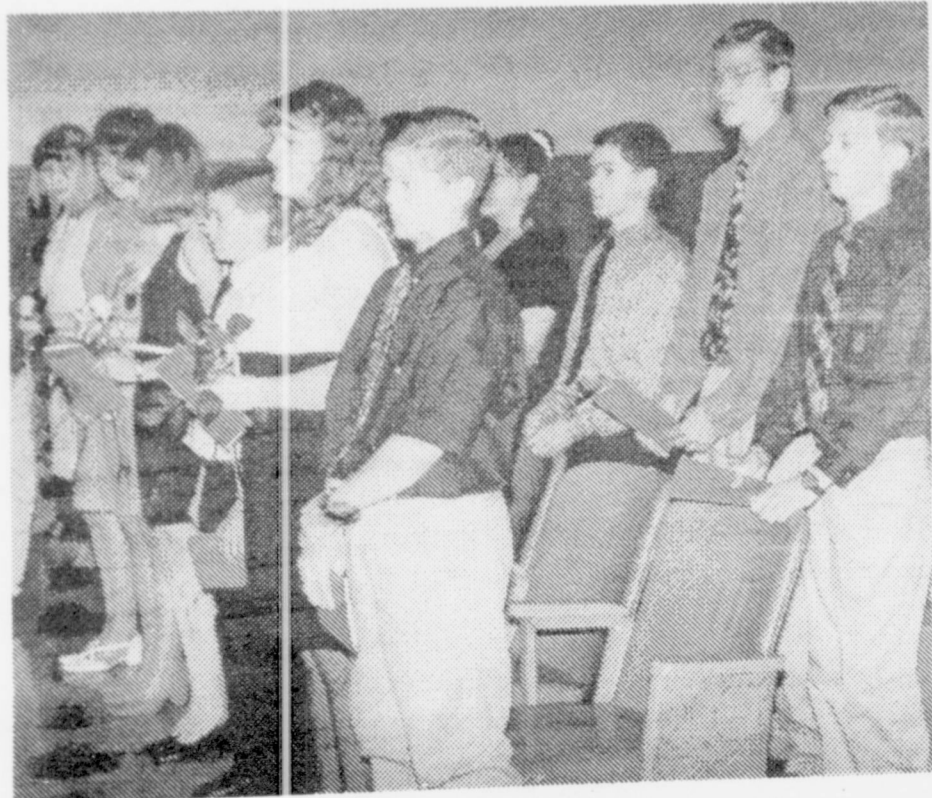

WHEREAS, it is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Order was adopted was open to the public, and public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given, all as required by the Texas Government Code, Chapter 551.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF GRANDVIEW-HOPKINS INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

1. That an election shall be held between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 7:00 P.M. on June 27, 1998 in said District at the following designated polling place:

Grandview-Hopkins Independent School District
Farm to Market Road 293 off Highway 70
Groom, Texas

Said District shall constitute a single election precinct for said election, and the following election officers are hereby appointed to hold said election:

Presiding Judge: Cindy Babcock

Alternate Presiding Judge: Bernice Maddox

2. That the Presiding Judge shall appoint not less than two nor more than five qualified election clerks to serve and assist in conducting said election; provided that if the Presiding Judge actually serves as expected, the Alternate Presiding Judge shall be one of such clerks.

3. That the early voting clerk shall be Solomon Kepley. Early voting shall be conducted by personal appearance and by mail at:

and during the period early voting is required or permitted by law, being June 10, 1998 through June 23, 1998, the hours designated for early voting by personal appearance shall be from 8:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. on each day except Saturdays, Sundays and legal state holidays; and the early voting clerk shall keep said early voting place open during such hours for early voting by personal appearance.

4. That an early ballot board is hereby created to process early voting results, and Solomon Kepley is hereby appointed as the presiding judge of said board. The presiding judge shall appoint at least two other members of the board.

5. That all resident, qualified electors of said District shall be entitled to vote at said election.

6. That a substantial copy of this Order shall serve as proper Notice of said election, and the President of the Board of Trustees shall cause said Notice to be published one time, not earlier than the 30th day or later than the 10th day prior to the date set for the election, in a newspaper published in said District or, if none is published in said District, in a newspaper of general circulation in said District. In addition, not later than the 21st day prior to the date set for the election, the President of the Board of Trustees shall cause said Notice to be posted on the bulletin board used for posting notices of meetings of the Board of Trustees.

7. That at said election the following PROPOSITION shall be submitted in accordance with law:

PROPOSITION

Shall the Board of Trustees of said District be authorized to issue the bonds of the District, in one or more series, in the aggregate principal amount of \$2,000,000, for the purpose of the construction, renovation and equipment of school buildings in the District, with said bonds to mature, bear interest, and be issued and sold in accordance with law at the time of issuance; and shall the Board of Trustees be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes, on all taxable property in the District, sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds?

8. That the official ballots for said election shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code so as to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid PROPOSITION with the ballots to contain such provisions, markings and language as required by law, and with such PROPOSITION to be expressed substantially as follows:

9. That, in all respects, said election shall be conducted in accordance with the Texas Election Code.

Local Happenings

Early Detection Is Key Factor in Surviving Skin Cancer

Many occupations in the Panhandle of Texas require people to spend a lot of time outdoors. Ranching and farming are two big examples. This time spent in the Texas sun increases the risk of skin cancer.

Skin cancer is far and away the leading type of cancer in the USA. Over one and a half million cases are diagnosed a year, and that is a conservative estimate of the actual numbers of skin cancers a year.

Skin cancers come in three basic varieties: Basal cell carcinoma; squamous cell carcinoma; and melanomas.

Basal cell carcinoma accounts for 800,000 or more cases a year. Basal cell carcinomas, fortunately are relatively "good" cancers and chances of living a long life are good. That is because most basal cell carcinomas do not metastasize, that is, they do not get into the blood or lymph and "seed" and grow in other organs like most other cancers do. Basal cell carcinomas just stay put; however, left untreated for years and years, they can destroy the nose, the ear, or invade the brain. Basal cell carcinomas are nicknamed "Rodent Ulcers" because that is what they look like.

They usually begin as a small, shiny, raised area that enlarges slowly and looks wet or glistening. Then it becomes engorged with blood vessels and ulcerates in the center. Recurrent crusting and bleeding and healing are not unusual.

These cancers almost always affect sun exposed areas such as the nose, face ears or lips.

There are many ways basal carcinoma can look, however, and dozens of skin lesions can masquerade as basal cell carcinoma. Treatment consists of biopsy; cauterization (burning); excision (cutting it away); or x-ray therapy. Here at The Groom Community Clinic we can examine any skin lesion and begin appropriate treatment early, before any complications arise.

Squamous cell carcinoma is the second leading type of cancer in whites, and the first among African Americans.

These cancers also arise on sun-exposed areas in most cases; however, they can occur anywhere on the body. They can develop in normal tissue, but often they develop from actinic keratoses or burn scars. (Many people in this area are walking around with keratoses on the face or hands. These

are called precancerous lesions).

Squamous cell carcinomas can metastasize; early diagnosis and treatment is important. These cancers are usually caught early enough and the prognosis is usually very good. These cancers do not cause a great number of deaths in the USA, but they do have the capability of causing death and destruction, so early treatment is real important.

Squamous cell carcinoma begins as a red raised lesion that may become crusty or scaly. It may even become warty looking.

Here at the Groom Community Clinic, we can examine any skin lesion and determine the appropriate treatment plan.

Melanomas are "bad actors." These are skin cancers that from the pigment cells of your skin. They are very different than basal or squamous cell carcinomas. First, they metastasize very quickly, and can kill a person within months of diagnosis. They can quickly spread to the brain, liver, kidneys, lymphatics, or just about any organ system. Second, they are more common on variably exposed areas, in men the back is the number one area, and in women the thighs and the back of the legs are the number one area.

A history of just one blistering sunburn in a fair skinned person doubles the risk of getting melanoma later in life.

Melanomas also look much different. Remember the A B C D's of Melanoma. A = Asymmetrical. Melanomas are not symmetrical. Be concerned of any lesion that looks different on one side than another, if a line were drawn down the middle of it. B = Borders. Beware of any skin lesion with irregular, jagged borders or one that just "blends" into the surrounding skin. Also beware of lesions that have irregular elevations or mounds. C = Color. Beware of lesions that are multicolored, brown or black with shades of red, white or blue. D = Diameter. Beware of fast growing lesions that are larger than the size of a pencil eraser.

Melanomas must be diagnosed early. The later it takes to diagnose, the less the chance of survival. These lesions must be biopsied. A specialist is almost required once melanoma has been diagnosed.

Of course, many harmless skin lesions can also look like cancer.

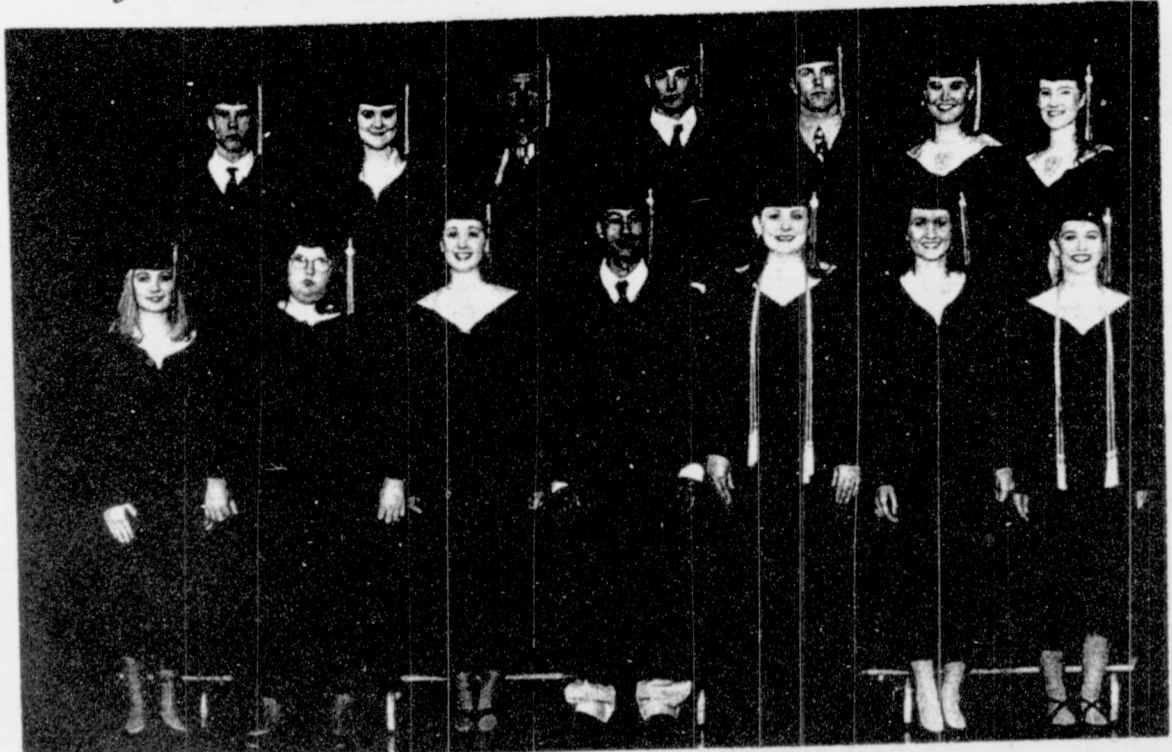

City officials will likely not seek any financial help in recovering from a ferocious wind storm that ripped through McLean on May 15.

"As far as I'm aware, we're not eligible for any aid, and nothing's been brought up where we're going to apply for any," City Secretary Toni Bohlar said.

The Gray County Appraisal District assessed losses at \$562,706, Bohlar said.

A mobile home was destroyed and 10 other homes sustained major damage in the wind

storm. Another 35 homes and 19 businesses were also damaged, officials said. Only one minor injury was reported.

Most of the damage in town was caused by straight-line winds, National Weather Service meteorologist Doug Crowley said. Wind speed reached up to 110 mph, he said.

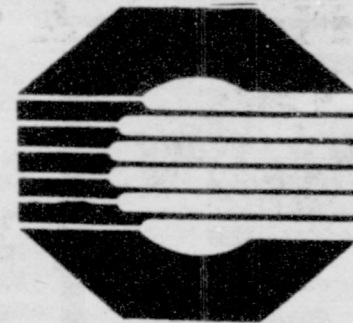
