





The council was in agreement that any citizen has the right to talk to any council member about any issues concerns that they might have and the council member has the right to decide how they will handle that concern. They were also that agreement that the general practice would be to invite the person with the concern or complaint to the next council meeting to present their concerns. If they could not make the next meeting, they could state complaint in complaint in writing.
The complaint or concern can be anonymous, it does not have to be signed by the citizen.




