The City Council of Mclean met in a special session Friday, May $19^{\mathrm{m}}$. 2006, in the City Hall. The meeting was called to order by the Mayor and opened with an invocation by Betty Taylor at 1.00 p.m. with the following members preseat: Bob Martin, members present: Bob Martin,
Betty Taylor, Molly MeDowell and George Shaw. Mindy Reeves was absent. City Employees present were City Secretary, Toni Bohlar, Chet and Sally Bohiar, Allen Mincon, and attomey, Patrick Phillip.

The Couscil thea proceed to fill the Aldernam position that was vacated by Teresa Simumens. Moily McDowell sominated Randy Stewart, Betty Trylor nominated Lavon Wetaon. Gearge Shew stated that he did not know Randy Stewart, Alderman McDowell akloed Mr. Stewart to stand up. Aldermean McDowell tated thas Mr. Stewart had exprespsd an interest in serving an the City Council and that he was the first person who had not turned her down.

In addition, this action caused the members of the City Council doubt in your integrity which cannot be tolerated. These actions bring disrepute to City, City officials and other employees and ars megatively affecting the daily operation of the City. It is my necommendation that your continued employment is not advantageous to the City and its governmental fiunctions, therefore on Friday, May 19*, 2006, the City Council will meot in City Hall regarau.. your emy..$y$ ment and ultimate disciplinarian action You disciplinarian action. You will be allowed to discuss this matter with the Council in Closed or Open Session, thersafter the Cowncil will deliberate in Closed Session, coming back to Open Session and hear and act on motions browght by the Council.

Alderman McDowell then said "I want to know when asking questions of anothe: person has become an accusation. I was under the impression that in the United States of America we have the right to ask questions. Ya'll right to ask questions. Ya il are trying to turn that into an accusation just because there

The Mayor acknowledged Chet at this time. Chet said " as you heard, I did ask that, I didn't come out and accuse him of it, I asked him and he said no and I said okay, you heard that. In the past of the City, this is by here say from the people who used to work here, we've had all kinds of things happen here at the City We've had employees get into fist fights, mpiveres get in we've had themtotal vehicles we've had them steal things, fail drug tests, I can go on \& on. Those people were never fired, they wamed them and they went on with their job,
most of them were here a long time before they retired or quit. I asked a question in an open meeting and I don't get a waming or nothing? You're just firing me. Your letter says because it's hurting the reputation of another employee, the Council and the City. I'm not no lawyer, City. Im not no a meople in here there's a lot of people in here a lot smarter than I am, but
uh, when I reported this a long time ago, I 've had my.... first thing, ya'li sent me to counselors, Inever understood why, ya'll asked me to, so I did it. That Counselor came back and seid that he didn't know what was going on, he didn't understand, it was didn't his acope, So ya'll beyond his scope. So ya'll sent me to a second Counselor. I think the only ones that went to the Counselor was me and the Director of Utilities, I don't know, but when we got the results back from that, you wouldn't let me hear them. But, I talked to him later and but, I talked wo him later and he said that he had nothing to say bed about me, he said he thought I was telling the truth, he ssid he didn't know really why I was there. After that, the thing was dropped for about 3 months. It was never brought up again. Then all of sudden Fridsy, and all we were there to do, well, ys'll were there to do, was to pick up replacement for the Utilities Director. Then all of this got brought back up. You know, you're talking about reputation, that hasn't helped my reputstion throughout this town very well, my names on everything, sending me to Counselors like there was something wrong with me and something wrong wiuh me and was tell on a co worker for doing gomething wrong. till works here and that's against the law and he's still working here and is probably going to keep working here, but now I'm being fired for asking a question in open meeting I don't understand it I know I have not done anying other than that, have ny ing ouker hat, have I? Is there something in my record that shows that I've done a bad job?

You've (looking at the Mayor) always told me that I'm a good worker. Have you not? Is there something? The Mayor said " You're presenting your case, I'm listening, we'll take this all listening, we 'll take this all into consideration when we deliberate, I'm serious about that, say what you want to." Chet said "I've done all I could, I've worked as hard as I can for this City, as far as I know, I've never been brought up on any problems that I've been doing...till now. It kind of, I don't think it's fair that I don't get a slap on the wrist or domething instead of just something, instead of just being fired. That's my point, I just don't think it's fair
The Mayor said "At this time, we'll go into Executive Session." The City Attorney then advised the Mayor that because Chet requested an Open Meeting, the entire meeting had to be held in Open Meeting. The Mayor then said "okay, then we can then said "okay, then we can
