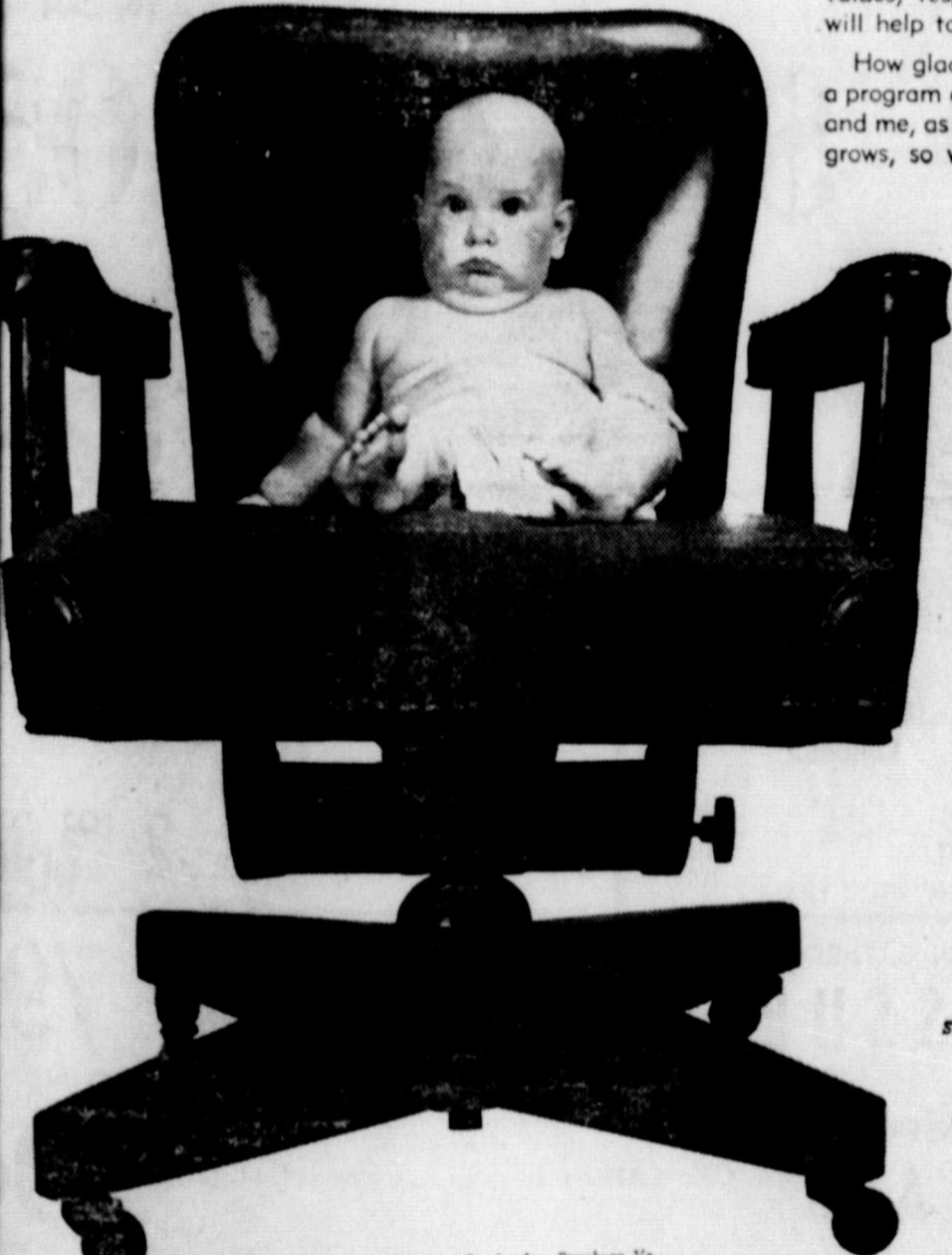

Texas A & M. College Extension Service

The Top O' Texas Junior Livestock Show will be underway on Sunday March 2. Deadline for weighing calves and pigs into the show is 12:00 noon. So to all McLean 4-H and FFA youngsters be sure to be on time.

Fact is there is a Gray County Show sponsored by the Lions Club of Pampa that will be held on Saturday, March 1.

From McLean there will be quite a list of youngsters in the show. Here are several that will be showing. Calves—Mike Long, Kit Long, Dennis Brooks, Cindy Brooks. Swine projects — David Haynes, Sheri Haynes, Danny Dalton, Terry Smith, Jeri Bible.

### CATTLE PRICES

A few weeks ago we pointed out a few things that could cause cattle prices to get a little wild. Most of these things have occurred. And cattle prices are now hitting all time high for two decades. Here is a run down on prices of cattle that have been sold recently to my knowledge. We know of two sets of cattle that came in from Mississippi. One double deck load cost \$33.67, the other \$34.57. These steers weighed a little less than 300 pounds. This was three weeks ago. The same calves would cost \$37.50 per cwt. today. Another set that came from the Fort Worth area cost \$35.27 and weighed 288 pounds.

One fellow called me from the Grandview Community yesterday and said, "I just set a record. I gave \$40.25 a cwt. for some little steers that weighed about 260 pounds." Another fellow called from Fort Worth this week and wanted to sell a double deck load of little steers that weighed 359 pounds. His price was \$35.75. This would be a little over \$28.00 per head for a calf weighing 359.

We might be approaching the point in this cattle cycle of prices that a word of caution would be in order. There is an old saying that might be worth repeating. Everything that goes up must come down.

I do believe we will see the market on cattle move up to a higher level. We stayed in the \$25 to \$29 bracket on choice steers in Chicago for a number of years. If the cow calf man is to survive we must move the price he gets up in the \$30.00 bracket. However I had rather see a more orderly and gradual price rise. I believe you will see some sharp roll back in price before 1969 ends. I don't see anything but an active market for the next few months.
