

This locally-owned business had its beginning September 9, 1939, when 160 miles of line were first electrified to serve 300 members. Since that time, 1,640 miles of line have been built, and today the Co-op is serving 2,900 mem-

The Rural Electrification Administration was set up as an agency of the U. S. Department of Agriculture. It was established on May 11, 1935, by executive order, and authorized to make loans at 2 per cent interest over a 25 year period.

On December 23, 1939, the loan was granted and work was soon underway on the Greenbelt Elec-
