Although extensive damage was done by the last fire the blaze was confined to the roof where the fire burned through wooden shingles under a roof of composition shingles.

Most of the household furnishings were saved.

Some have believed that only one application, which is usually made the freshman year, is enough, but this is not true; they must make application for transfer each year before June 1, for the next school term. I would like to suggest that you act on this immediately.

"Your attention to this matter immediately will be very important to you, as well as to the McLean school district.

(1 Pet. 4:11)

Despite the fact Jesus prayed for the unity of his followers (Jno. 17:20-21); that division is condemned; that the people of God are commanded to be of the same mind and speak the same thing (1 Cor. 1:10); those who claim to be Christians continue to maintain their divisions into sects, creeds, and denominations. Disunity is justified on the grounds that everyone is privileged to select the church of his liking and worship God, not according to his word, but according to the dictates of his own conscience. Every thinking person who has read the N. T. knows the existing divisions in religion are a sin. They know such a condition is the very opposite of God's holy will. Religious leaders are continually trying to devise ways and means to effect unity among those who profess to be followers of Christ. But the ways and means also continue to ignore God's plan for unity among those who claim to be Christians. Open your Bible and open your mind to its teaching. The inspired Apostle Paul says, "I therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you that ye walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called, with all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another in love; endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body, and one Spirit, even as ye are called in one hope of your calling; one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all." (Eph. 4:1-6) Paul wrote this hundreds of years before any religious denomination was ever heard of. If you belong to a denomination, no matter how old it is, it was NOT IN EXISTENCE when this was written. It is not therefore the church the Lord established. Let us analyze the above scripture that we may be able to see the picture God intends for us to get from it. Beginning with the first of these 7 planks in God's platform for unity Paul says, There is one body. This shows UNITY of ORGANIZATION. "For as the body is ONE, and hath many members, and all the members of that ONE body, being many, are ONE body; so also is Christ." (1 Cor. 12:12) THE ONE BODY is the church. 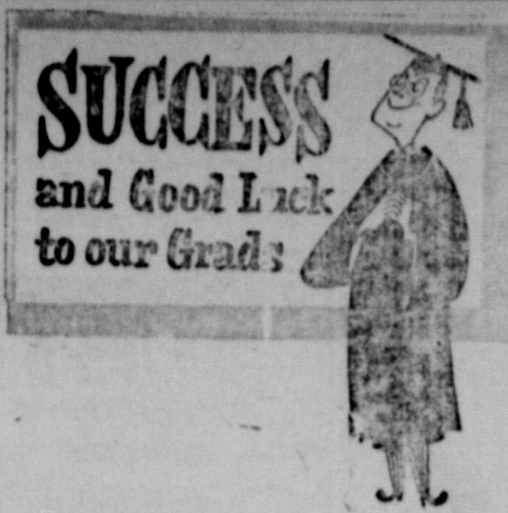

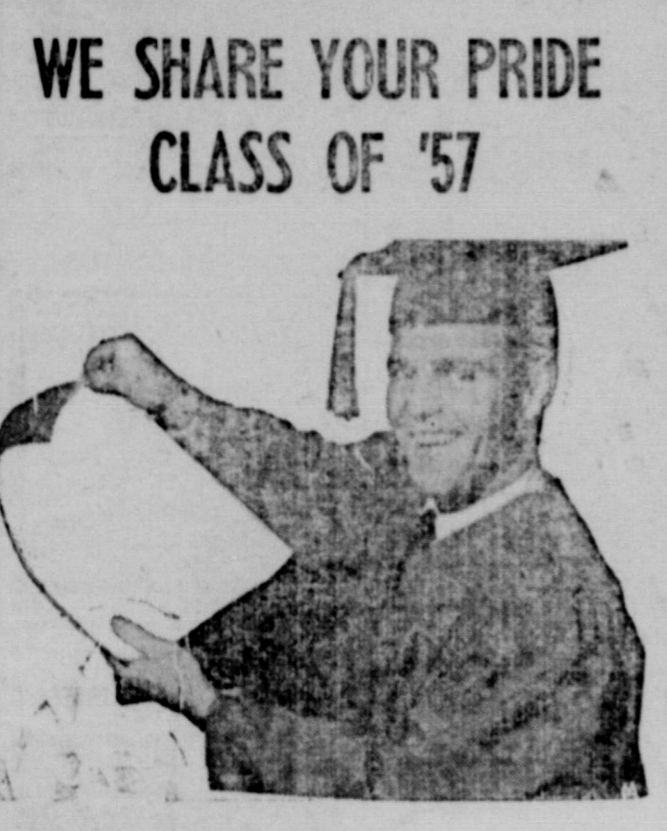

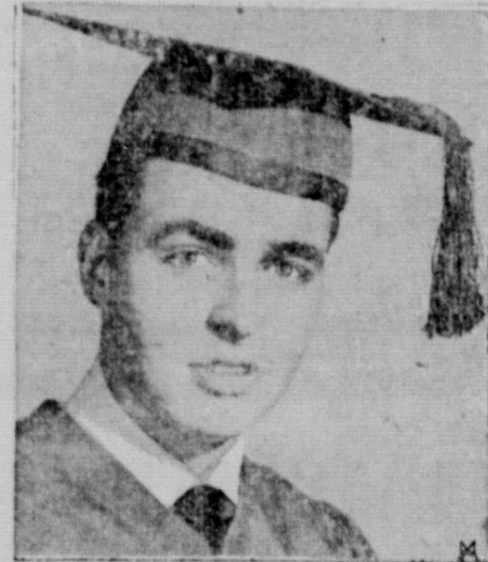
