If you are between 16 and 20 years old, your chances of drowning are higher than they would be in any other age group, according to tatistics compliled by the exas Parks and Wilduife epartment.
The Department's Wate afety Education Section stugitd the water-oriented
deaths between Sept, 1, 197 and Aug. 31, 1971, and determined that the 16-20 ears-of-age category was the most dangerous.

The next-most-danger-
ous age group was $0=5$ years
of age.
Generally, the older a person gets, the less prone he is, either from exper ce or suscep
drowning.
Not surprisingly, the spring Nos summer months produce the most drownings. How ever, more persons drowned in September than Aug. The more populous countes, of course, had more vic tims and more accidents within county lines than the less populated counties.
