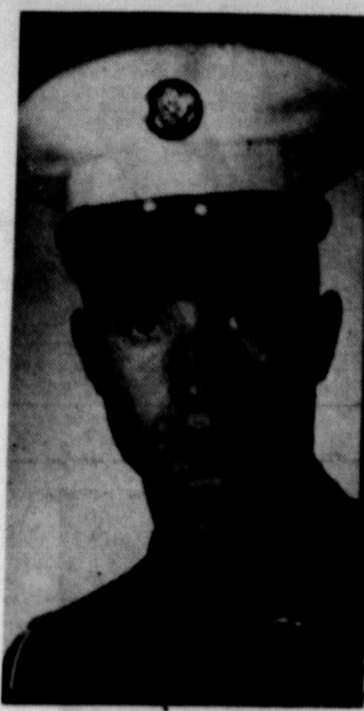


Dean Tate to Wed Vera Marilyn Colson

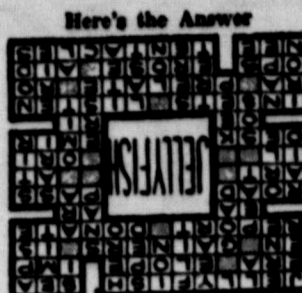

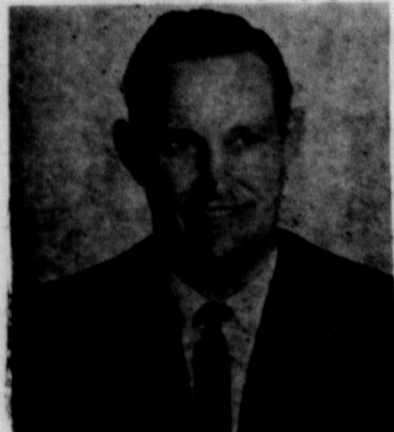

News From ALANREED

Spraying for Hoppers To Begin Near Here

Over 14,000 acres of grassland will be sprayed for grasshoppers in an area south of McLean in a grasshopper spray program, according to Ronald Goch, Donley County agent.

The spraying will start the last of this week or the first of next week, depending on when the contract for the flying is let. The program will cost about \$10,500, two-thirds of it being paid by the ranchers and the rest by the federal government.

The area being sprayed will include 7,806 acres in Donley, 5,260 in Collingsworth and 1,040 in Gray Counties.

The Donley County Grasshopper Control Committee was organized at a meeting in McLean last week to request assistance from the Plant Pest Control division of the United States Department of Agriculture for the spraying program. Officers include Forrest Preston of Childress, program supervisor; Alfred McMurtry, chairman; and Jess Kemp, secretary-treasurer. Committeemen are Jesse Coleman, Back Glass and Ronald Goch.
