Most fishermen dream of having their own private pond or, lake where they can sneak down and catch a good size bass and this is possible if proper pond planning, and management practices are followed.
Recent surveys have shown that farm ponds used substantially by fishermen throughout the state. More than 23 000,000 fishing recreation davs or about 35 per rips occur on these small bodies of water in Texas
