Log Jam Predicted For Motorists Who Delay **Car Safety Inspection**

Major Wilson E. Speir, Commander of Region No. 4 of the Deariment of Public Safety, announced today that Texas motorists may be lined up for blocks bedore Motor Vehicle Inspection Stations as the April 15 deadline nears for abtaining safety inspection stickers for cars and trucks. "Only 125,000 vehicles have received their safety inspection stickers, out of the one-half mil-Hon registered vehicles in Department of Public Safety's Region No. 4," said Captain R. M. Hammett, Commander of Motor Veheile Inspection Service of Region No. 4. "About ten weeks remain in which to obtain 1958 inspections and there are 375,000 vehicles still to be inspected in the 49 counties of Region No. 4". Captain Hammett pointed out that motorists are subject to a fine of one dollar to two hundred dollars, plus court costs, if they are apprehended without a valid safety inspection sticker.
