Confessed Killer Abandoned Car Of Victim Near Here

Negro Who Killed Taylor Farmer, Hitched Ride From Ozona

George Williams, 28-year-old Negro who was arrested Saturday in Roswell, N. M., and is alleged to have confessed the robbery slaying of a retired Williamson county farmer near Taylor, Texas, Friday morning, abandoned his victim's car five miles east of Ozona and hitched a ride west out of Ozona.

Sheriff Billy Mills found the abandoned car near the Air Force station east of Ozona and personnel at the base reported to the sheriff seeing a negro man leave the car afoot about mid-afternoon Friday. The man later hitched a ride through Ozona to the west and was arrested in Roswell the following day.

Taylor officers were notified and fingerprint men lifted prints from the car here yesterday before towing it back to Taylor.

Charles Heise, 69, a retired Williamson county farmer living at Taylor was murdered Friday morning while fishing near Taylor. 




