Two Polio Cases In Ozona Prompts **Vaccination Drive**

Salk Shots Urged For All: 4th Booster Is Recommended

Reports of two paralytic polio eases in Ozona in recent weeks has prompted Mrs. Jack Wilkins, chairman of the Crockett County Chapter of the National Foundation to urge immediate Salk vaccine shots for all persons who have not yet had such shots and a fourth or booster shot for those who have had the recommended three shots.

Stephen Newton, 3-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Tommy Newton, is reported making satisfactory recovery after treatment in Shannon Hospital in San Angelo for what physicians diagnosed as an attack of polio. The child is said to have suffered some muscular weakness but will make full recovery, physicians said.

The other case is the 9-monthsold daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jesus Perez who is still in serious condition at the Perez home here after receiving treatment at the San

Angelo hospital. The Salk vaccine is especially recommended for all children but any person up to 50 years of age should receive the immunization. Those who are financially able to have the shots should do so at once and for those who cannot pay for the vccinations efforts are being made to arrange for free administration, Mrs. Wilkins said. Ozona doctors have proffered their services for such charity inoculations, Mrs. Wilkins said, and efforts will be made to get a supply of vaccine through the State Health Department.


