

Official Ozona rain gauges with one more day to go in 1964, revealed that Ozona receivel 15.90 inches of rain in 1964, going a bit over an inch better than 1963's mark, thanks mainly to a wet September which saw most of Crockett County get big rains and Ozona in particular get 5.47 inches.

However, the big rain story in Crockett County this year depended on where you lived. In the southern part of the county, including Ozona, to some extent, the year was one of disastrous drouth. But if you lived in the north, it was a year of wonderful rains and good grazing, of course some areas more than others

Shannon Field Gets Extension; Kincaid Gasser

The Escondido multipay field of Crockett County gained its third Ellenburger producer and a 1/2-mile east dual completion of Contintal Oil Co. No. 2-8 J. M. Shannon, Fusselman producer, 141/2 mles northeast of Iraan.

It was finaled for a daily flowing potential of 263 barrels of 40.2 gravity oil, plus 27 per cent water, with gas-oil ratio of 46-1. Production was through a 2inch choke and perforations at 9,254-257 feet; 9,260-264 feet; and 9.294-9.303 feet. whch had been acidized with 10,500 gallons.

Top of pay was picked at 9,252 feet on elevation of 2,759 feet. Total depth is 9,450 feet, where 512-inch casing was set.

It was finaled Sept. 14 from the Fusselman for 257 barrels of 48.2 gravity oil plus 8.9 per cent water, through a 20-64-inch choke and perforations between at 8,824-36 feet.

Location is 712.5 feet from the south and 1,950.9 feet from the east lines of 8-2-GC&SF.

Humble Oil & Refining Co., No. 2-D Cox, in 5-QR-D&SE, s-mile north and very slightly west extension to Canyon sand production in the Ozona, East multipay field of Crockett County, three miles southwest of Ozona, flowed 36 barrels of condensate and four barrels of water in 24 hours, plus gas at the daily rate of 3.9 million cubic feet.

Flow was through a 14inch choke and perforations between 6,211 - 257 feet. Testing continued.






