Besides the large amount of money allowed for regular traveling expenses the State reimburses officials and employes for using their own cars, and this reimtursement bill last year exceeded \$200,000. But in addition the State bought gasoline to the amount of \$105,000. The light and power bill amounted to \$223,000 and fuel cost the State \$307,000. For drugs and chemicals the State paid out \$130,000; for hotel and room rent \$100,000 was expended. The stationery bill was \$107,000 but this does not include printing of reports, text books and

For clothing and dry goods the bill was \$160,000, and for lumber it was \$58,000. For automobile remairs \$29,000; new passenger cars \$32,000 and new trucks \$7,000. There is a bill for \$218 for airplane repairs but there is nothing in the report to show that an airplane has been bought. ### THE DWINDLING FAMILY

Cincinnati Enquirer: Sir Raymond Unwin, British housing expert now visiting the United States, calls attention to a significant trend in population statistics which has a very important bearing on low-cost housing projects. In England, Sir Raymond points out, a million low-cost dwellings have been built with government aid in the period since the war, and yet the country still faces a housing shortage. This he ex plains by the trend to smaller families.

In 1911, the average English family consisted of 4.55 persons. In 1931, it was only 3.91 persons. Thus, despite the slowing down of population growth, there are 36 more families in each 1,000 peopple than 20 years ago. This means tion, or 18,000 more dwellings and lion population.

en world stands aghast at what is happening now in this "peaceable" Germany, but nothing can be done about it. First an internal military oligarchy ruled the Germans and dragged them into the World War-and abandoned them to their fate when the war had been lost. Now another gang, entirely different but equally ruthless, is in the saddle, trying to maintain ontrol by the sword. Again, nothing can be done about it.

Those who raise a hand against his new dictatorship are plainly old that they will lose their head. If they do not like this, they can ommit suicide, as hundreds of housands have done.

### Statewide Program Of Beautification Plan For Centennial

DALLAS, Texas, Oct. 9, (Spl) -A blanket of beauty, expressed by the blossoming of countless acres of flowers and shrubs to be planted over the State in preparation for the Texas Centennial celebration in 1936, will result from work of the State Highway Beautification Committee.

In the section around Dallas, a comprehensive program in seven counties is due to be launched soon through co-operation of city and county governments. As soon as first choice has been determined for the flower or shrub in this section, every highway leading into Dallas will be planted.

Similar work is due to be car ried on in every section of the State so that thoroughfares leading to historic shrines in such cities as San Antonio, Houston, Goliad, Brenham, Nacogdoches Hunts ville and other cities, where Cen-San Benito Light: Everything I tennial celebrations are to be stag ed, will be similarly beautified.

Corsicana has led this section of the State in selecting the flower that will be used to decorate the highways in her community. The red rose will be used on rights-of-way in that vicinity. Houston has chosen the crepe myrtle, while Galveston long has been identified with the oleander. have been chosen for the entire State, other shrubs and flowers will be chosen by the individual communities.

The highway work calls for the securing of a number of wayside parks and parkways along the major highways so that the entire State will be covered by a systematic program of beautification.




