The new secret ballot, provided by a new election law, will be in use in a primary election for the first time this year. The new ballot has a perforated tab in an upper corner with a number corresponding to a number on the ballot proper. The voter detaches this perforated tab, signs his name on the back and deposits the tab in a separate box from that in which the judge deeposits his balbut the number does not correspond to that on the ballot, election judges being required to "shuffle" the ballots so that they are not handed out in consecutive numbers. The tab boxes remain sealed and unless an election contest develops, are destroyed in two months. This system makes it impossible for an election official or anybody else to check a marked ballot with a poll list number to see how a particular voter cast his ballot, except a court in case of a contested election.
