County To Employ Pound Man To Thin Out Stray Dogs

Wholesale Killing of Livestock Reported On Nearby Ranches

The Crockett County Commissioneres Court has declared war on damage to ranchers whose lands

A pound man will be employed by the county in the near future and it wil be his job to capture or destroy all stray dogs known

Ranchmen on all sides of Ozona have suffered losses at the hands of stray dogs, but particularly heavy losses have been suffered to gomery recently lost nearly 150 Spanish kids, killed by roaming dogs. Early Chandler lost a blackface ewe, killed by dogs and oth-

ers have been visited by the strays, There are many dogs roaming the city that have no homes and forage for their own food from day to day. These are the most dangerous types and these are the dogs the pound man will round up in the coming campaign.

In order that owners of pet dogs might have warning and time to take steps to keep their dogs from falling into the pound man's net. County Judge Houston Smith prepared an announcement on behalf of the Court, published elsewhere in this issue, in which he cited provisions of the law relative to what are classed as stray dogs and who has the right to destroy known or suspected depredating dogs.

Crockett county has a dog license law which requires that all dog owners register their pets and place license tags on the animals. However, registering an animal is not enough. Any dog running at large between sunset and sunrise, whether tagged or not, is classed under the law as a stray and as such, can be impounded. Or if a dog is known to have killed or injured any domestic animal or fowl is found about to kill or injure such an animal or fowl or anyone depredation, then such a dog may be killed by anyone or the owner may be required to make restitution for damage inflicted.

Any dog running at large at any time without a license tag is classed as a stray and thus subject to impounding and destruction.
