NATIONAL BIBLE WEEK

National Bible Week will be observed from October 15 to 21 this year. It is sponsored by the Laymen's National Committee, a non-sectarian and non-profit organization whose mission is to encourage belief and faith in God, daily reading of the Bible and religious education for all. The work of the Committee has been endorsed by the President, governors, members of Congress, and leaders in industry, labor, and the professions.

Today, in a world which has been corrupted by cynicism and fear, a thorough knowledge of the teachings of the Bible is more important than ever before. The world's most terrible problems have resulted from the loss and destruction of those spiritual values which our ancestors held to be preeminent. As Walter H. Judd, National Chairman for the Week has said, "Because American pioneers had a firm belief in the

spiritual fatherhood of God, they put first in their scale of values the freedom and dignity of individual man as a spiritual being. As a result their political system released, for the first time, the creative capacity inherent in men everywhere. We shall not live victoriously, either as individuals or as a nation, except as we come to know God and His eternal laws and love through eternal searching of the Scriptures." The greatest strength of a people lies in the realm of the spirit.

OUR GREATEST DANGER

Herbert Hoover's most recent major address dealt with the subject of honor in public life. In the course of it, the ex-President said thus: "Dishonor in public life has a double poison. When people are dishonorable in private business, they injure only those with whom they deal or their own chances in the next world. But when there is a lack of honor in government, the morals of the whole people are poisoned. . . ."

"Our strength is not in politics, prices, or production, or price controls. Our strength lies in spiritual concepts. It lies in public sensitiveness to evil. . . ."

"The issue is decency in public life against indecency. . . ."

"Our greatest danger is not from invasion by foreign armies. Our dangers are that we may commit suicide from within by complaisance with evil. Or by public tolerance of scandalous behavior. Or by cynical acceptance of dishonor. These evils have defeated nations many times in human history. . . ."

"The redemption of mankind by America will depend upon our ability to cope with these evils right here at home. . . ."

Remember that next time you read of five-percenters, mink coat and deep-freeze "gifts" to government officials and employees, sordid tie-ups between politicians and gamblers, and morally indefensible activities within the RPC and other government agencies. These things are terrible symbols of moral decay. As Mr. Hoover has eloquently warned, that decay could destroy us more surely than any foreign enemy.

**Self-Employed Must Pay Social Security, Secure Number Card**

If you are one of the millions of self-employed people newly covered under federal old-age and survivors insurance, you need a social security account - number card, according to George Clark, manager of the San Angelo social security office.

"Self-employed people who were brought under the Social Security Act by last year's changes in the law will report their net income from self-employment at the same

time they make their federal income tax return; early each year," Mr. Clark said.

the numbers will not actually be needed until early next year, self-employed businessmen should apply for them in the near future.

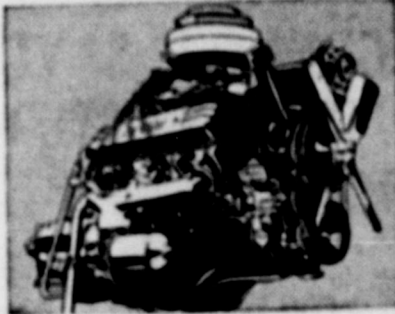
This will help avoid any delay when the numbers are needed. "If you have ever had a social security number, that same number should be used."

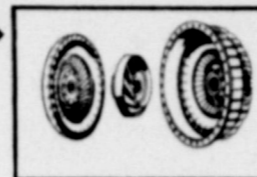

## 1951 TAXES NOW DUE

### Earn Prompt Payment

### Discount

Your 1951 county, state and school taxes are now due and payable.

Except for school taxes, the same discount schedule for prompt payment as in previous years will be in effect this year. The discount will not be allowed on school taxes, but on county and state portions of the total tax bill, a discount of 3 per cent will be allowed in October, 2 per cent in November and 1 per cent in December.

If you mail in your tax remittance, deduct the amount of allowable discount, taking only the county and state portion of your taxes for computing the deduction. No discount may be taken from your school tax or poll tax.

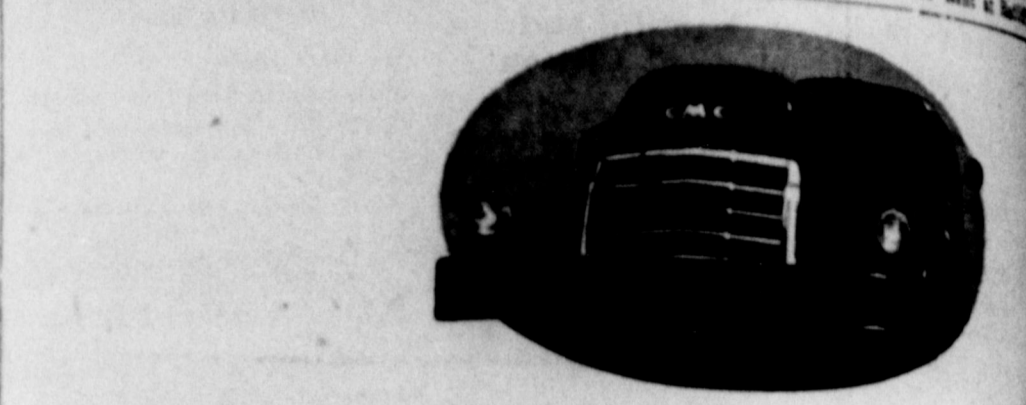

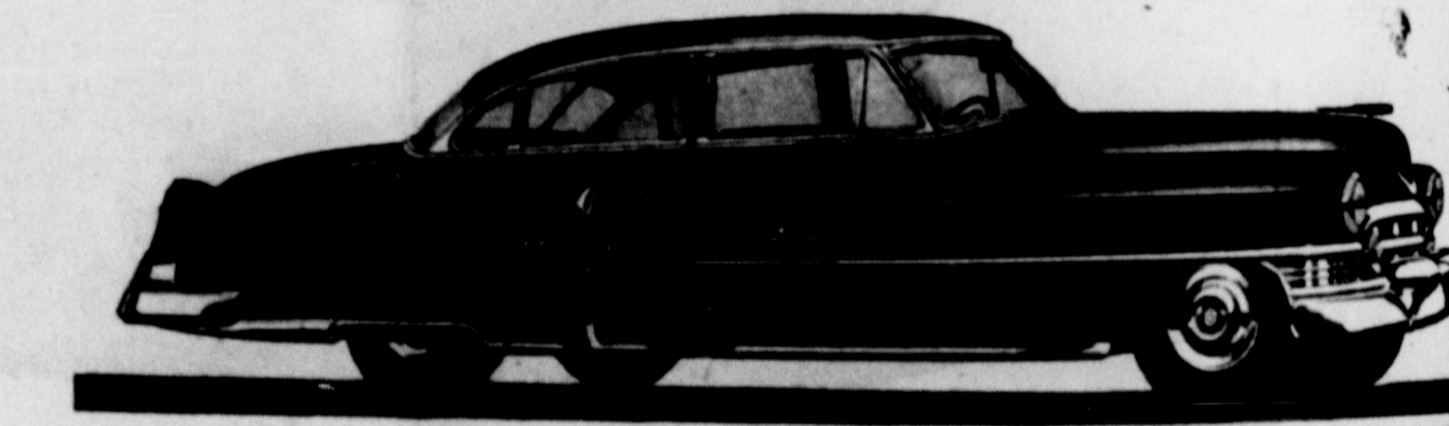
