Schools Open With Enrollment Increase of 67

High School up 19 to 106 Total; S. Elementary up 57

Ozona Public Schools opened Tuesday morning for the 1951-52 tinguished and the truck went to session with opening exercises in a second fire about ten miles out. the high school auditorium at 8:30

Enrollment figures for the opening day as announced by Supt. Lem Bray show an increase of 67 pupils in the entire system over last year's beginning. The enrollment total was 718 pupils in all branches of the system, an increase from 651 on opening day

The largest enrollment increase was in the South Elementary where a jump of 57 pupils over the last year opening was noted. The South Elementary enrollment figure was 258 against 201 last year. Whether or not this openday increase will mean a net gain of that many pupils in the year's average can not be determined, however, until comparisons can be made at later dates.

For the first time, the high school enrollment soared past the 100 mark on the opening day. The high school enrollment figure was 106, an increase of 19 from last year's opening at 87 pupils.

A loss of 17 pupils was registered in the North Elementary, this year's opening enrollment being 202 pupils against 219 last year. The Junior High School showed a net gain of seven pupils, 142 enrolled this year against 135 last year. The school for colored pupils gained one in enrollment, 10 this year against 9 last
