In the whole 50-year period, only 6 years had exact average rainfall of 21 inches.

The graph seems to make it quite clear that the present drought began in 1942, 12 years ago. The previous year, 1941, had been a peak-year with 31 inches. In 1942 it fell to the median, 21 inches. Next year, 1943, it dropped to 13. In 1944 it came up a little to 19 inches (which included an estimate based on a 12-inch snow.) Thefollowing year, 1945, it went back to 13. In 1946 it hit the alltime low of the 50-year period, 7 inches. This was the driest year in the whole record. The following year, 1947, had only 12 inches, 19-48 had only 14. In 1949 it climbed a little above the median, to 23. But in 1950 it fell back again to 18 inches. The year 1951 had only 9 inches, and 1952 had 8, which is next to the lowest low in the
