### New Ellenburger Strike In Crockett County Indicated

Continental Oil Co. 1-E Harris, Crockett County wildcat in 4-3-WCRR, 10 miles northeast of Iraan, has indicated discovery production in the Ellenburger.

On a one-hour and 23-minute test between 10,031-10,098 feet, gas surfaced in 30 minutes. Recovery was 540 feet of oil and gas-cut water blanket, 630 feet of free oil, and60 feet of gas-cut mud. Flowing pressure was 350-3,500 pounds.

On a 21/4-hour drillstem test beween 10.096-10.131 feet, there was a strong blow of air. Drillpipe was ull of gas. Recovery was 740 feet f free oil, 500 feet of water blankt, and 60 feet of salt water. Flowng pressure was 375-525 pounds.

Operator then cored from 10,131 feet to 10,178 feet, the total depth and at last report was pulling core. The project topped the Ellenburger by samples at 10,025 feet on elevation of 2,616 feet.






