#### **Crockett Casts** Token Vote In **General Election**

#### Six Amendments Favored; Sprinkle Of Local Write-In

Only a little more than a fourth of the qualified voters in Crockett county cast their ballots in the general election held Tuesday despite the fact that eleven proposed amendments to the Texas constitution, which will have far-reaching effects on taxpayers in the state, were at stake.

A total of 348 votes were cast in the county, out of a total possible voting strength of over 1200. The voters in this county were overwhelmingly for the Democratic slate, but Republican gubernatorial candidate Tod Adams received 32 votes to Governor Allan Shivers 286. Senator Lyndon Johnson received 268 votes to 48 for Watson

and 1 for Spangler. Voters in this county approved six of the eleven constitutional amendments and disapproved five. Approved were the \$7 million dollar annual increase for Old Age Assistance, 204 to 87; Teacher-State Employe retirement credit, 167 to 116; for Social Security coverage of state employes, 152 to 126; for the state building fund from the Confederate pension tax, 195 to 99; for permitting military personnel to vote, 207 to 84, and for permitting small counties to requiring women to serve on ju-Cubs struck back for two more of the mistakes made by the Eag- for county and precinct officials, 169 to 121, and permitting crea-

Public opinion is effective only as it is expressed. You and I cannot express the opinion of everyone else, but we can express our ewn. And it makes more difference than we imagine. Your elected public official respects your opinion more than anything else on earth, for it is his passport to honor or to oblivion.

When you, one ordinary person, are moved by a political conviction and will sit yourself down and take your pen in hand and over your signature express that feeling in a plain, direct, but courteous way, and mail the letter to your congressman or President. you have done one of the most consequential things a citizen can do. It will have its effect; never

By this method you can multiply your influence at the polls a thousand times. A vote cast is one expression of opinion. A letter written in your own hand is another expresson of opinion. Unless we are willing to let wrongs go unchallenged, and unless we are willing that organized pressure groups with their paid loobyists shall rule the country, more of us ordinary people will have to express ourselves by letter more often.


