
Tardy Ranchmen Are Asked To Report By Sept. 1, ASC Plans

Money made available for payment for the various approved practices being carried out in this county under the ASC program has been allotted to each operator who signed up at the first of the year to participate. With only four months remaining in the year, Mrs. Dunlap said, it is necessary that ranchmen who have not yet made a move to use their portion notify the office by Sept. 1 of their plans. Those who do not indicate by that date their intention to use their allotment will be cropped from the list and the money allocated to other operators. Notification has been received

Hardy told the Governor that once the network is completed, it will be "the best and most upto-date storm warning system now available anywhere in the world"

Hardy added that storm reporting and the general warning service maintained by the US Weather Bureau will be extended and improved tremendously by the installation of the equipment, which is able to detect heavy rainfall, tornadoes, hurricanes and other severe weather manifestations.

The US Weather Bureau ties the radar net into the Department of Public Safety communications system through special arrangements between the two organizations. All Weather Bureau radar reports are received by Public Safety Communications within about two minutes after a warning is issued.

Once reports are received, Public Safety units track the storm and warn people who are in its course. The Public Safety units also advise the Weather Bureau as to whether the storms are turning into tornadoes. 000




