Editorially Speaking

WHAT WILL YOUR ANSWER BE?

Whether or not the people of Texas can successfully defend themselves against outside pressure groups will be known after the balloting in Saturday's run-off primary. Whether or not northern "liberals", hired goons of the PAC, and an avalanche of gold do-gooders who want to see Texas whiplashed and responsive to the subjugated and responsive to the whiplash of party politics, can overcome the good sense of Texas voters will be decided in Saturday's vote. The Texas way of life is under attack by determined forces—forces with evil intent. An Austin lawyer, a two-time loser in politics, is ostensibly the spearhead of this attack. But actually this man, Candidate Yarborough, but as the unscrupulous mouthpiece of the Communist conspiracy against Texas, he becomes the symbol of all the evil forces at work trying to undermine the economy, Texas political independence and Texas freedom of thought. This is not to say that Ralph Yarborough is a Communist. But Ralph Yarborough is being used and backed by those forces that put it as charitably as possible, are being used by the Communists. Read the story of Port Arthur, how the Communist dominated nation moved in and virtually paral-

For instance, the statement that the Rangers had been withdrawn from Duval county there then and now belied the statement. He sought thus to insinuate that Governor Allan Shivers was on the side of the George Parr gang in Duval when all the world could read the results of the first primary which gave Yarborough a two to one majority over Shivers in Duval county. This is the man who has made promises that could not be made realties without unearthing incredible new sources of tax income. This candidate has promised, among other things, a bonus to veterans, a big system of dams in the state, a vastly expanded highway system, and huge increases in expenditures for public welfare. Now the fiscal budget required to run the entire state of Texas is something like one-half billion dollars a year. With a little calculation it can be shown that Yarborough's promises would cost three and one-half billion dollars! Where does he think this money is coming from? A sales tax? he asks. A state income tax? No, he says. Where, then? Why he propose to place a tax on gas pipelines. Well, that sounds good enough to most voters, not many of whom happen to own or have an interest in pipelines. But the joker is that such a tax has already been declared unconstitutional. It was tried several months ago as a possible means of getting more money for Texas teachers. These impossible promises, these untruths and insinuations, these founded charges of wrongdoing of one sort or another to cover up the revelation of his own unavailing associates are things that Texas voters should think about when they go in the polls next Saturday. Allan Shivers has made Texas a good governor. Texas has a cash balance in its treasury. Texas has the state government. Texas has the finest highway systems in the nation and a highway de-

TEXAS FARMERS-RANCHERS WARNED OF CIO LABOR PLANS

AUSTIN, Tex., Farmers and ranchers of Texas were warned this week that the CIO plans to organize the farm workers of Texas if its candidate wins the Governor's race. This warning came from Governor Allan Shivers who charged that the backers of his opponents "want to turn the state government over to the same bunch that is trying to wreck Port Arthur." "One of the first things they would do is put one of their red-hot organizers from Port Arthur in as labor commissioner. Then every time a farmer or rancher wanted to hire someone he would have to go through the CIO." Governor Shivers said there was no doubt in his mind that the aim of the CIO after the job of organizing industry in Port Arthur and along the Gulf Coast is finished is to begin organizing farm labor in all parts of Texas. "You can imagine what will happen when the CIO starts dictating how many laborers are needed to plow ten acres of land, refusing to allow a man to work more than thirty-five hours a week during the harvesting season and telling how much a farmer can charge for his crop," he said. The Shivers administration, the Governor said, has worked hard to help preserve and protect the rights of the working man. "But as long as I am Governor, the professional labor bosses who have been sent to Texas from the East—specifically those in the CIO and its Political Action Committee—are not going to run our State Government," Shivers promised. Shivers said the average working man in Texas appreciated good government and that they were not going to let CIO bosses and professional organizers from the East do their thinking—and voting—for them.

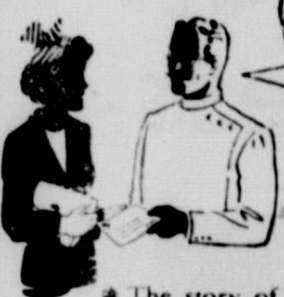

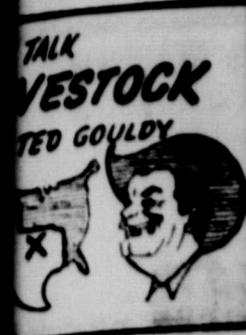

We are told that the "nubbin" corn produced in many parts of the Eastern third of Texas, will also be fed to cattle. This corn was of too poor quality to be salable, and when ground with cob, shuck and all stepped up with some protein and some urea to increase the digestibility, it will put pounds on cattle.

Our information is that many farmlets of from half a dozen to a couple of dozen head of cattle will be fed this way and some of the larger feeders will be "in" again this year.

The bankers are losing the purse strings on farmers in the Corn Belt and more stockers and feeders are moving into those states.

Order buyers at Fort Worth say that they have more orders for the "good kind" than they are able to find in the runs lately.

Many of these are going into Illinois, Indiana and into the Western Corn Belt. However, the demands spreading to the Eastern Corn Belt and over into the South East as some relief from heat and drouth has been reported in some sections there.

It looks like a big year for cattle feeding in the West. Fort Worth's dealers and order buyers report heavy demand continues from Arizona and the West Coast.

The West Coast operators are filling feeding pens and are still taking lots of the "plainer" kinds of stockers and feeders off the yards at Fort Worth every week.

The feeling seems to be general that cattle prices have been pretty well established with the better fat steers and heifers due to sell around the \$20 to \$25 range. This more stable situation seems to be predicated on the present earning power of the consumers and the

proportion of their expendable income that will be spent on meat.

On Monday's market, prices were strong, spots higher and calves were 50 cents and more higher than last week's close.

Sheep and lambs found the market generally steady with choice Spring lambs up to \$19 and feeder lambs at \$15 down.

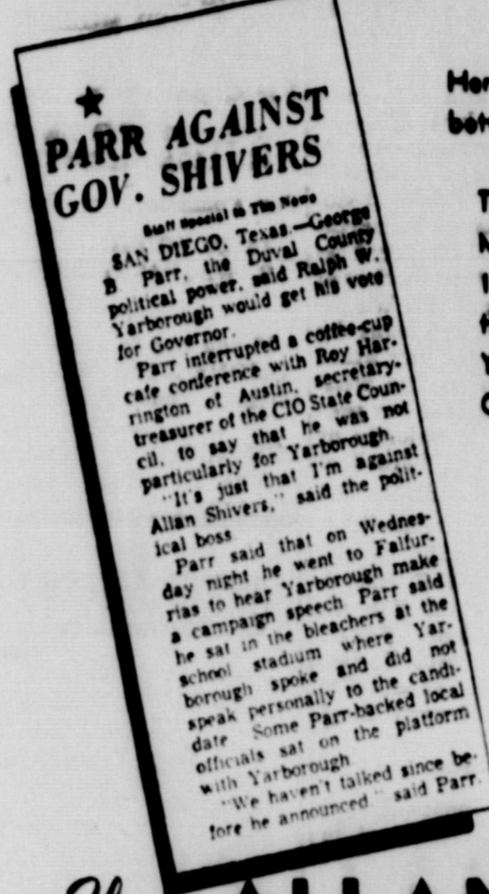

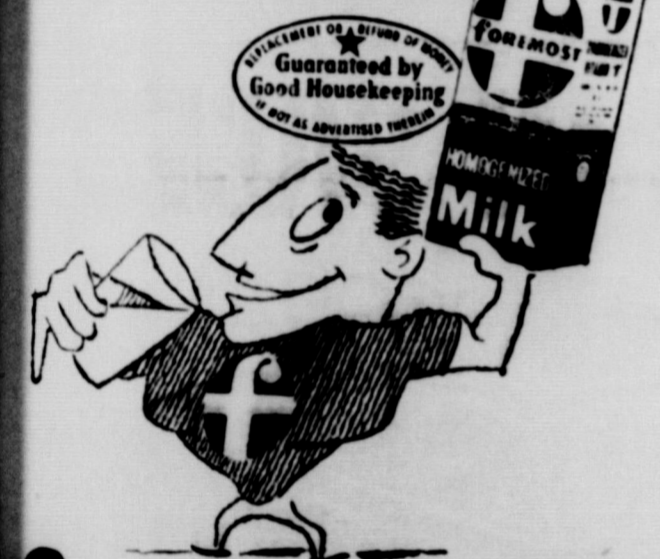

TO THE PEOPLE OF TEXAS:

A person should put up with a lot before he gets mad at his neighbor; and, therefore, we did not get mad when our neighbor, Mr. Ralph Yarborough, took a stand against our school children by joining forces with those northern politicians who wanted to steal the Texas tidelands, or when Mr. Yarborough allied himself with the C.I.O. or when Mr. Yarborough announced a program that would more than double our taxes, but we did get mad, extremely mad, mad all over, when he charged that Travis County precinct 229, where we live, had always been a Republican precinct.

**Radar Storm Warning System Is Installed**

AUSTIN — A network of radar stations which will give Texas the best storm system now available in the world will soon be completed.

There are now 11 stations in operation, and three more will soon be in operation. Another at Lake Charles, La., which serves a section of Texas will add up to 14 in operation for this state.

E. L. Hardy, regional director of the US Weather Bureau, has advised Governor Allan Shivers that the last three in the chain will be in operation within six weeks at Austin, San Antonio and Lubbock.

Besides the one at Lake Charles those already functioning are at Amarillo, Victoria, Brownville, Corpus Christi, Houston, Abilene, Fort Worth, Galveston, Midland, San Angelo, and Wichita Falls.

Hardy told the Governor that once the network is completed, it will be "the best and most up-to-date storm warning system now available anywhere in the world".

Hardy added that storm reporting and the general warning service maintained by the US Weather Bureau will be extended and improved tremendously by the installation of the equipment, which is able to detect heavy rainfall, tornadoes, hurricanes and other severe weather manifestations.

The US Weather Bureau ties the radar net into the Department of Public Safety communications system through special arrangements between the two organizations. All Weather Bureau radar reports are received by Public Safety Communications within about two minutes after a warning is issued.

Once reports are received, Public Safety units track the storm and warn people who are in its course. The Public Safety units also advise the Weather Bureau as to whether the storms are turning into tornadoes.
