"The most perfect example is the Soviet Union," she wrote. "Why do the people of Russia continue to pay taxes when the state which owns everything and employes everybody has all the profits that once went to private persons? Can't they support the state apparatus out of these? No, they cannot. And the reason they cannot lies in the nature of the state as such, which is first and last the police power and is absolutely insatiable.

"Nothing the state gets society is ever returned. At what point, then, should its aggrandizements be halted? I say they should be halted whenever private persons can accomplish the same things even approximately as well The burden of proof should always be on the state.

This principle should be made the test of whether or not to put government into the power business or any other form of business. There can be no excuse whatever for having the government do what the people can do for themsevles. Most important of all, limitation of government is the first essential step in maintaining any nation's treedoms.





Experiment Shows Grazing Cattle And Sheep Together Best

COLLEGE STATION — Cattle and sheep grazing together at the Sonora Agricultural Experiment Station each have made consistently higher gains than when grazed separately.

Only small differences were noted in weight gains and mohair production when goats were pastured with cattle and sheep.

These are the findings of a series of combination grazing studies commenced in 1949 and recently concluded. The studies are reported by Leo B. Merrill, range management specialist at the station and Dr. Vernon A. Young, head of the department of range and forestry of the Texas A. & M. College System.

Tests were made in 12 80-acre native grass pastures with the following stocking rates; heavy 48, moderate 32 and light 16 animal units per section of land. Six sheep or six goats or one cow makes a single animal unit.

Cattle made "significant" gains both per acre and per head during the five year test when grazed in combination with sheep and

goats, regardless of stocking rate.

Under heavy grazing, average weight gain for each cow was 40 pounds, or a gain of 12.9 pounds per acre for cattle grazing alone.

14.6 pounds for cattle and goats together and 15.9 pounds for a combination of all three. Moderate and light grazing exhibited similar

comparisons in the gain of cattle.

Average gain of the three stocking rates was 62.4 pounds for cattle in combination over those grazing alone. Sheep gave about the same results as cattle. When stocking rates for all years were averaged, sheep had a weight increase of 9.1 pounds per acre in combination and 6.2 pounds when grazed alone, or an advantage of nine pounds per animal.

A trend which favored the stocking of goats in combination was not established.

Complete results of the studies are given in Progress Report 1726. Copies are available from the Agricultural Information Office, College Station, Texas.


