A street is to be opened between the cafeteria and the Junior High as a convenience in reaching the cafeteria and the street will serve as a much needed outlet for traffic on the occasion of basketball games and other entertainment in the gymnasium. The street will be blocked off with a gate on Highway 163 side when not in use for school functions.
