With population increases in all of these counties since 1950, with the exception of Concho, Irion, Kimble, Mason, Menard and Sutton, the reduction in per-capita assessment will bring approximately the same budget as that based on 1950 census.

The Crockett county suggested budget this year was set at \$595 against \$594.45 from the 1951-55 figure. Budgets from other counties in the Council area, based on the new population and 14-cent per capita assessment are: Concho, \$602; Irion, \$196; Kimble, \$560; Mason. \$686; Menard. \$476; Regan, \$555; Schleicher, \$462; Sutton, \$524, and Tom Green, \$10,220.




