The Pledge of Alloglance to the Flag of the Unitted States first came finto widesprond uasige tirst came into wa Columbus Day, 1892.

In the 77th Congrese, its offictal recognition whe cranted then Congress coditied all rules and customs pertaining to the display and use of our Fiag. Then, in 1954, the words "under God" were added to the Pledse. by congress.

In the year 1620, the Mayfower Compact, aceument which contained the first constitution in America for complete seli-government, declared in the opening sentence "In the nameot God. Amen."

On July 4, 1776, our founding Fathers proclaimedour Deciaration of Independence wich no lees than four times refores to the existence of the Creator.

It was during the Presidency of Abraham Lincoln that Conof Abraha linction gress directed the inseription "In God We Trust" be placed a gur coins.

With this in mind, several Congressmen and Senators suggested legislation adding the phrase "under God" to our Pledge. Congressman Oliver Bolton asked that there be no comma separating "one nation" from "under God" and the Conress adopted his version in 1954

Thus, when the Pledge is recited, it should be rememberec that nothing stands between our Nation and our God, and nopaus should occur at this point in ite recitation.
